WHEREAS, The 256 Egungun Festival honors those who have come before  
us with a processional march through the streets to raise the vibrations

WHEREAS, Furthermore, as an initiated priest in several spiritual systems, Chief Sekou Alaje holds the title of Babalawo (Ifa Priest), Olosun (Osun Priest), and Olu Ana (Owner of the Sacred Drum); he serves as the Senior Priest at The Ogundase Ifa Temple, a temple dedicated to spiritual practices from Yoruba Land, West Africa; the founder of 256 Healing Arts, a practitioner network providing access to various indigenous healing modalities; and the 256 Academy for African Spirituality, an institution educating its members in the arts of African spiritual systems; and
