Senate Passes Bill to Toughen Laws for Driving Under the Influence

I joined my colleagues in the Senate on Monday to pass legislation that creates new penalties for individuals supervising another driver while also under the influence of drugs or alcohol. Also known as Abbagail's Law (S.164C), the bill aims to deter careless individuals from threatening the lives of children, and the lives of innocent bystanders and travelers, through reckless actions. Under the legislation, a supervising driver with a blood-alcohol concentration (BAC) of 0.18 percent or more would be charged with a Class E felony. If the BAC is lower, they would face a Class A misdemeanor.

With the passage of Abbagail's Law, the Senate is sending a strong message that the dangerous and irresponsible action of supervising unlicensed drivers while under the influence of drugs or alcohol will not be tolerated.

The bill has been sent to the Assembly.
