Legislatively Speaking

In last week's Community Connection, I talked about a special birthday that was recently celebrated in Albany for Lauren Shields. As I mentioned, my Senate colleagues and I passed legislation earlier this month. Lauren's Law, named after 11-year old heart transplant survivor Lauren Shields, would boost the number of eligible and willing organ donors by requiring driver's license applicants to specifically indicate their donation decisions.

According to the New York State Department of Health,

every year, more than 1,500 people receive kidneys, livers, and hearts that have been donated for transplantation. However, with more than 9,000 New Yorkers still on waiting lists, the need for organ donations far exceeds the supply.
