## Written Testimony Submitted to Joint Legislative Public Hearing on 2020-2021 Executive Budget Proposal: Topic Taxes

My name is Allison Downing. I live in Morningside Heights, Manhattan in Senator Robert Jackson and Assemblymember Daniel O'Donnell's districts.
