New York State Resources Available

511NY

Motorists are reminded to check 511NY by calling 511 or by accessing www.511ny.org before traveling. This is free service allows users to check road conditions and transit information.

Mobile users can download the updated, free 511NY mobile app from the iTunes or Google Play stores.

The app now features Drive mode, which provides audible alerts along a chosen route while a user is driving, warning them about incidents and construction. Users can set a destination prior to departing and receive information on up to three routes.
