Medicaid waste, fraud

O'Mara supports legislation

**ALBANY** | State Senator Tom O'Mara, R-Big Flats, is sponsoring legislation to reimburse counties across New York that buy computer software designed to identify Medicaid waste and fraud, he announced Wednesday.

The software was developed by Salient Corp., based in Horseheads.

It is already used by a dozen counties, includ-

Known as data mining software, it compiles complex data and simplifies it for analysis, allowing inspectors to

ing Chemung County, as well as the Office of Medicaid Inspector General.

"easily and quickly visualize the behaviors of providers, recipients, pharmacies and others involved in Medicaid," according to Salient Corp.

New York has the most expensive Medicaid program in the nation, costing approximately \$50 billion per year, but ranks only 26th in fraud recovery.

O'Mara's proposal was introduced in the state Senate.

Western N.Y. braces for more severe weather

**MORIAH** | Western New York braced for more violent weather Wednesday as emergency officials assessed the damage in three northeastern counties where dozens of roads flooded and some were washed out by severe thunderstorms that dumped more than 2 1/2 inches of rain on parts of the Adirondacks.

The National Weather Service issued a tornado watch for all of the state west of Syracuse until 10 p.m. Wednesday and said some thunderstorms could include damaging winds and hail.

Authorities in Chautauqua County south of Buffalo said a heavy gust of wind likely caused the death of an inexperienced 39-year-old motorcyclist who lost control of his bike on Interstate 86 earlier Wednesday, WIVB-TV reported.

By late afternoon, flash flood watches and flood warnings were in place in most of the rest of the state as a second day of storms was expected.

The earlier storms that rolled across upstate on a northeasterly track starting Tuesday afternoon dropped nearly 2 inches of rain in the Syracuse area and

1.5 inches to 2.7 inches in the three-county region in the state's northeast corner by Wednesday morning, according to the weather service in Burlington, Vt.

**Man arrested in beating, stabbing**

**ELMIRA** | Elmira police have arrested an Elmira man for allegedly beating and stabbing another man early Wednesday.

Fabian A. Bonaparte, 29, has been charged with first-degree attempted assault, a class B felony.

According to police, officers responded to a report of a fight involving three men at approximately 2:23 a.m. Wednesday in the area of East Church and Judson streets, near Heritage Park Apartments.

Officers found the vic-

tim, Jay Monroe, 53, of Elmira, lying on the ground after being assaulted and stabbed multiple times.

Monroe and witnesses gave police a description of two assailants, and Bonaparte was located and arrested a short distance away, police report.

Elmira police are still attempting to locate the other suspect and are asking anyone with information to call 737-5626 or 271-HALT.

Monroe was hospitalized after the attack. Bonaparte is being held in the Chemung County Jail.
