Klein, will spearhead this effort in the Senate." O'Mara said government spending is the state's number one reform challenge. "If we can't get our own house in order, we can't cut taxes for working families, create a better business climate for employers to create jobs, or do the

thousand other things it takes to turn this state around," O'Mara said. "It all starts with getting government spending under control." O'Mara said the Senate task force will complement other ongoing efforts to reform the state's
