AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to extending the buffer zone
around a religious service, funeral, burial or memorial service

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assem-
bly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The opening paragraph of section 240.21 of the penal law,
2 as amended by chapter 566 of the laws of 2008, is amended to read as
3 follows:
4 A person is guilty of disruption or disturbance of a religious
5 service, funeral, burial or memorial service when he or she makes unrea-
6 sonable noise or disturbance while at a lawfully assembled religious
7 service, funeral, burial or memorial service, or within [~~one~~] three
8 hundred feet thereof, with intent to cause annoyance or alarm or reck-
9 lessly creating a risk thereof.
10 § 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after
11 it shall have become a law.

TITLE OF BILL:

An act to amend the penal law, in relation to extending the buffer zone around a religious service, funeral, burial or memorial service

PURPOSE OR GENERAL IDEA OF BILL:

To extend the buffer zone around a religious service, funeral, burial or memorial service.

SUMMARY OF SPECIFIC PROVISIONS:

Section 240.21 of the penal law, as amended by Chapter 566 of the laws of 2008, is amended to increase the buffer zone from one hundred feet to 300 feet.

JUSTIFICATION:

In 2008, legislation was signed into law (Chapter 566) to address a series of intemperate protests that were taking place at military funerals across the country. These protests continue today. The U.S. Supreme Court, in a recent decision, U.S. Supreme Court decision, Snyder v. Phelps. 562 U.S., recognized that persons who protest at funerals of military personnel have constitutional rights, but also that states have a compelling interest in protecting the family and friends of deceased military personnel while they are mourning at such events.

This legislation seeks to protect a family's privacy by increasing the buffer zone around a religious service, funeral, burial or memorial service.

PRIOR LEGISLATIVE HISTORY:

New bill; refer to Chapter 566 of the laws of 2008.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS:

None.

EFFECTIVE DATE:

This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after it shall have become law.
