# Report on Planned Construction in Clinton-Hell's Kitchen and its Impact on Area Public Elementary School Capacity: 2009-2019

Conducted by NYS Senator Thomas K. Duane with Manhattan Community Board Four

In August 2009, State Senator Duane and Manhattan Community Board Four (CB4) analyzed information available from the Environmental Impact Statements submitted to the New York City Department of City Planning for pending residential construction in the neighborhood bounded by West 34th and 59<sup>th</sup> Streets, 8th Avenue and the Hudson River.

#### Planned residential construction will add 1,350 new elementary school students by 2019:

New York City-mandated documents for the planned Western Rail Yard development and a building being constructed by Two Trees Management Company on 11<sup>th</sup> Avenue show that there are 26 new residential developments planned or under construction in Clinton-Hell's Kitchen, which are expected to contain 11,259 units.<sup>1</sup>

Using the Department of City Planning's own conservative formula (0.12 elementary school students per unit built), we estimate that these new developments will result in approximately **1,350** new elementary school students in Clinton-Hell's Kitchen by 2019.<sup>2</sup>

### About one quarter, 324, of these new students can be accommodated through:

## Existing Excess Capacity at Local Elementary Schools

According to the Department of Education's *Blue Book*, there is a net excess capacity of **147** seats at the two zoned elementary schools in the area:

- P.S./I.S. 111 205 seats available<sup>3</sup>
- P.S. 51 58 seats overenrolled<sup>4</sup>

#### • The Expansion of P.S. 51

P.S. 51 is slated to be expanded by 354 seats, which have not yet been identified as elementary or middle school seats.<sup>5</sup> For the purposes of this report, we assume that half, or 177, will be elementary school seats.

Net: 177 Seats

Subtotal: 324 Seats
