Labor Day History...

Some facts about Labor Day, which we will celebrate on Monday, from the Department of Labor:

- The first Labor Day was celebrated on Tuesday, September 5, 1882, in New York City. Two years later, the first Monday in September was selected as the holiday in New York City. By the end of the decade, 8 states had passed legislation to create the Labor Day holiday.
- Labor Day is a dedicated to the social and economic achievements of American Workers.
- In 1894, Congress passed an act making the first Monday in September of each year a legal holiday in the District of Columbia and the territories.
