Mr. Murphy's influence extends beyond local initiatives, as evidenced by his presidency of the Board of Visitors for the NYS Rockland Psychiatric Center, and his involvement with the Orangetown Narcotic Guidance Council and the Rockland County Board of Mental Health, Mental Retardation & Alcoholism. He is the founder of the Rockland County Child Advocacy Council, a co-founder of the Rockland Autism Symposium, and a board member of Abbott House, St. Dominics Home, and St. Agatha's Home. He was inducted into the Rockland County Civil and Human Rights Hall of Fame because he exemplifies selflessness, leadership, and commitment to improving society in every capacity.

His service reflects the profound impact one can make, and he is a true role model in every respect. Mr. Murphy is a well-deserving addition to the New York State Senate Veterans Hall of Fame.
