# Cultural and Recreational Activities Bryant Park

## Art Cart

Daily 11am-7pm, April through October. The Art Cart is located on the north end of the Upper Terrace, across from the Bryant Park Cafe. Free equipment is provided.

## Beekeeping

On July 18, from 12pm-1pm, visit the Reading Room for beekeeping classes. You'll learn about honey bee colonies and the vital role they play in the natural environment. Anyone interested in learning more about bees and beekeeping are welcome.

## BINGO

On Wednesdays in June, from 7pm-8:30pm, at the Fountain Terrace at the 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue & 41<sup>st</sup> Street park entrance, play bingo with comedian host, Andy Ross, and music by DJ Flip Bundlez. Prizes are awarded for every win. No registration required.

## Camp Kids

On summer weekends, from 12-1:30pm on Saturdays and Sundays, bring kids for a fun filled afternoons with music, magic and puppet shows in the Reading Room.

## Reading Room

On Wednesdays from May 28<sup>th</sup> through August 27<sup>th</sup> 12:30pm-1:45pm, admired and bestselling authors offer advice and discuss their latest books. Hosted by Ilana Levine, actress and podcaster, Little Known Facts with Ilana Levine. On Wednesdays July 9<sup>th</sup> through September 3<sup>rd</sup>, 7pm-8pm, join for lectures and conversations with historians, authors, and thinkers. With a storied history in the park, the Reading Room provides the free use of books, newspapers, and magazines in the park during warm weather months. You'll also find a robust schedule of literary events, including Books on Broadway, Author, BookClub, Poetry, StoryTime, and more.

## Tai Chi

Tuesdays from 7am-8:30am, April 29<sup>th</sup> through August 26<sup>th</sup>, practice this traditional system of health and self-defense on the Fountain Terrace. Classes are led by teachers and students who train nearby at CK Chu Tai Chi. Classes meet on the Fountain Terrace, and are rain or shine. All levels are welcomed, and no equipment is necessary.

# Cultural and Recreational Activities

## Gansevoort Beach

Located in Hudson River Park between Gansevoort Street and Little West 12<sup>th</sup> Street, and opposite the Whitney Museum of American Art, Gansevoort Peninsula delivers a wide array of spaces for lounging, fitness and fun. It is a white sand beach complete with beach chairs and umbrellas. Built on solid ground (as opposed to a pier), visitors will have direct access to the Hudson River for non-motorized boats and stunning views of the River, the lower Manhattan skyline and Day's End, a monumental, site-specific sculpture by David Hammons donated to the Park by the Whitney Museum of American Art in 2021. Swimming is not permitted.

## Lincoln Center's Summer for the City

From June 11–August 9, Lincoln Center is offering hundreds of free and Choose-What-You-Pay performances and cultural activities for all ages. [Click here for the full event calendar.](#) Expect global dance parties, experimental opera, kids' storytimes, jazz nights, pop-ups and more. For free events, over half the venue capacity is always available for General Admission. Just show up; no tickets needed! Entry to most performances and events is available for FREE via General Admission—first-come, first-served.

## New York Botanic Gardens

On Wednesdays, from 10am-11am, Grounds Admission is free to NYC residents all day and to all other visitors. Grounds Access Pass includes access to outdoor gardens and collections, including the Everett Children's Adventure Garden. The pass does not include admission to the Enid A. Haupt Conservatory, Special Exhibitions, or Tram Tour.

## NYC Bird Alliance

NYC Bird Alliance connects New Yorkers of all ages and backgrounds with the world of birds in the City through educational programs, outings, and events across the five boroughs. Most events are free, and great for beginners. NYC Bird Alliance believes birds belong to everyone and we welcome all New Yorkers—from curious newcomers to experienced naturalists—to explore the City's diverse bird life with us.

## NYC Culture Pass

Call your library system for New York Public Library: 917-275-6975

Cardholding patrons 13 and older of Queens Public Library, Brooklyn Public Library and The New York Public Library can reserve passes for free admission to participating cultural institutions including many of the museums listed below. Reserve a culture pass through the website by selecting the date and venue you wish to visit. Note that passes are in high demand so they may be limited. You can print or download the pass from there, but once you have done so you cannot cancel it. You will be asked to present ID at the institution when you bring your culture pass. You can only reserve a culture pass for a specific institution once a year, but you can have multiple for different institutions.

## Museums

American Museum of Natural History

Pay what you wish for New York State residents (with ID). Timed entry tickets are required.

Asia Society and Museum

Free admission is offered on Fridays. Reservations for timed entry admission are recommended, but walk-ins are welcome.

Center for Jewish History

Entrance is free, but visitors are encouraged to reserve tickets on their website in advance.

## El Museo del Barrio

Pay what you wish. Reservations for timed entry admission are strongly recommended, but walk-ins will be admitted on a first-come, first-served basis.

## Frick Collection

On Wednesdays from 2pm-6pm, pay-what-you-wish admission is offered.

## Metropolitan Museum of Art

Suggested donation for admission for New York State residents, but you must pay something.

## Morgan Library and Museum

On Fridays from 5pm-7pm, with reservation, admission is free. Reservations for timed entry admission are strongly suggested.

## Museum of Art & Design

On the first Thursdays of July, September, and August, from 5pm-8pm, free admission is offered. You must book your tickets in advance.

## Jewish Museum

Entry is free on Saturdays. Reservations for timed entry admission are strongly recommended.

## Museum of the City of New York

Free for everyone on Wednesdays. Pay what you can for New York residents.

## Museum of Modern Art

On Friday evenings from 5:30pm-8:30pm, free admission is offered to New York State residents. Tickets must be reserved in advance.

## Neue Galerie

On select Fridays, from 5pm-8pm, free admission is offered on a first-come, first-served basis.

## New York Historical Society

On Fridays, 5pm-8pm, admission is pay-as-you-wish.

## Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum

On Mondays and Saturdays, from 4pm-5:30pm, you can pay what you wish for admission.

## Whitney Museum

On Friday evenings, from 5pm-10pm, admission is free. Admission is also free all day on the second Sunday of every month. Advance tickets are recommended. All visitors 25 and under receive free admission every day. The gallery on Floor 1 is always free.

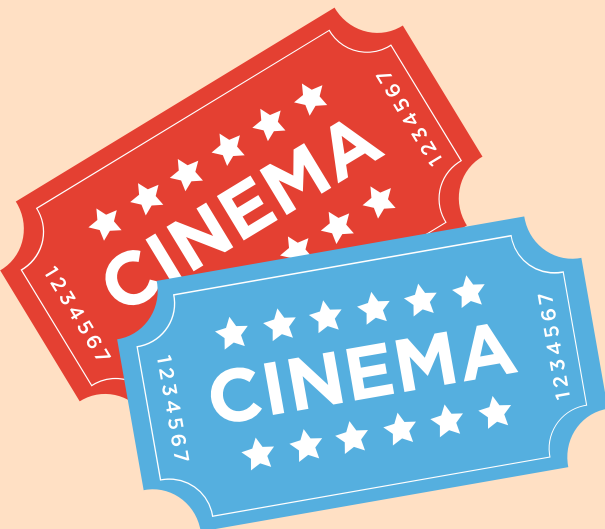

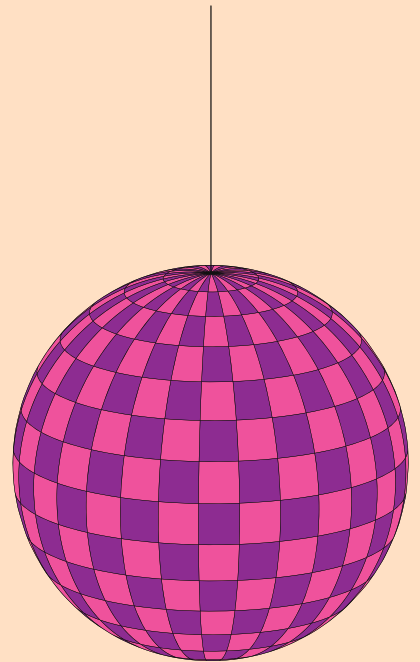

This year, Shakespeare in the Park presents Twelfth Night at the revitalized Delacorte Theater featuring Peter Dinklage, Jesse Tyler Ferguson, Lupita Nyong'o and Sandra Oh. Performances run from August 7<sup>th</sup>-September 14<sup>th</sup>, every night at 8pm except Mondays. All performances are FREE, but you must have a ticket to attend. There are five ways you can obtain a ticket, listed below:

1. In-person distribution at Central Park: Tickets will be distributed at the Delacorte Theater on performance days at 12pm. There are separate lines for individuals 65+ and those with disabilities. A Public Theater Patron ID is necessary to obtain a ticket. Click [here](#) to make an account.
2. In-person lottery: There is a lottery drawn at the Public Theater at 425 Lafayette Street on performance days at 12pm. You need a Public Theater Patron ID to participate.
3. In-person distribution in the boroughs: Tickets will be distributed at 12pm on select dates and at select locations throughout NYC. Click [here](#) to determine the dates. A Public Theater Patron ID is required.
4. Digital lottery: The TodayTix mobile application runs a digital lottery on most public performance dates.
5. In-person standby line at Central Park: After the final ticket is distributed, people can wait in line at the Delacorte to see if they can be admitted after 6pm.

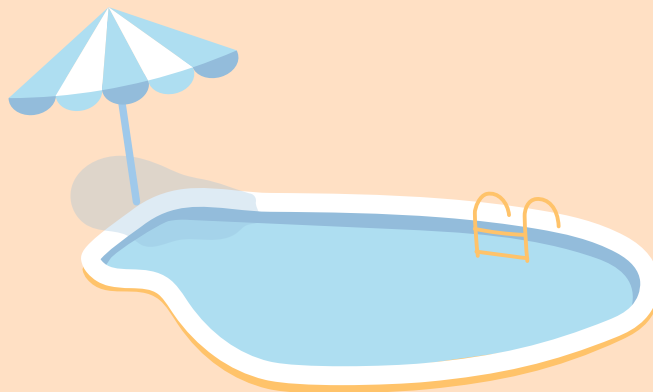
