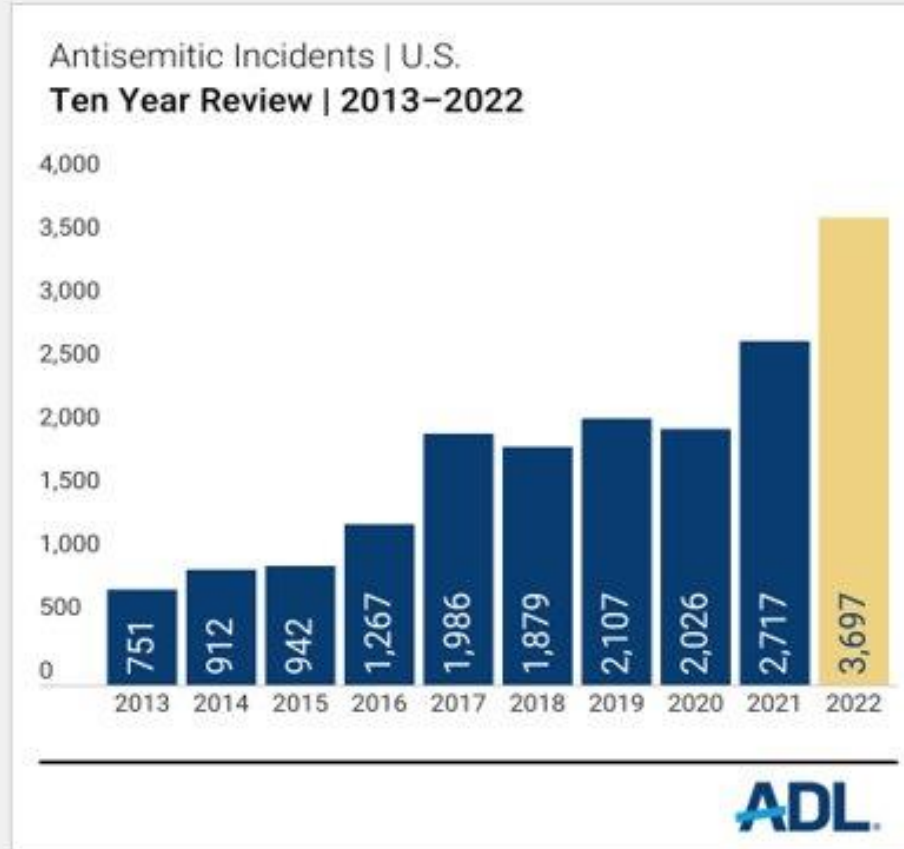

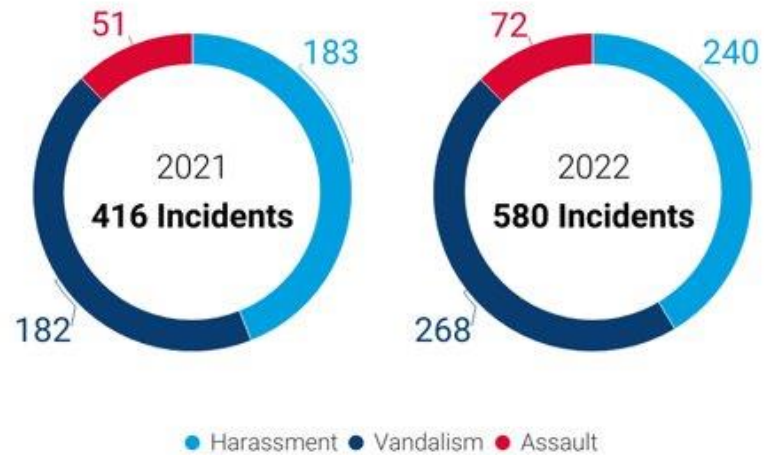

Antisemitic Incidents | New York

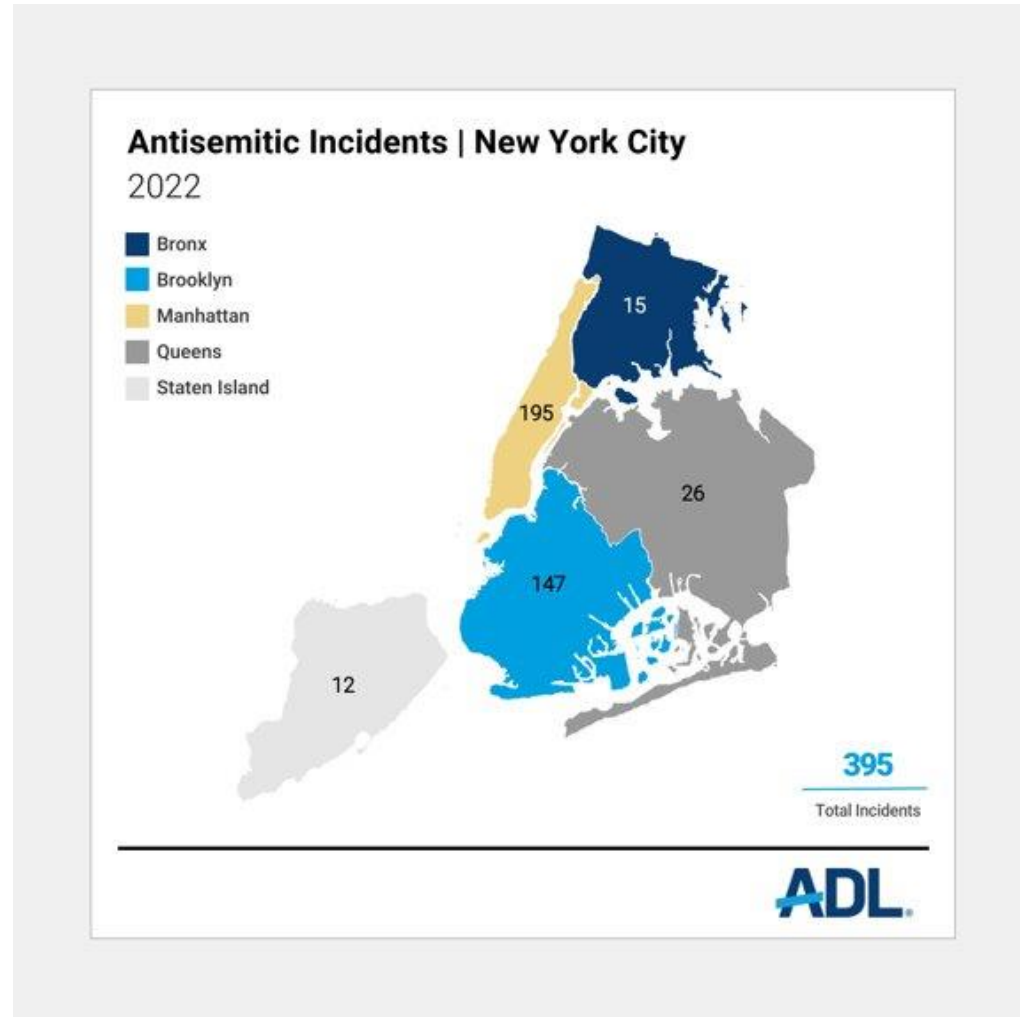
▲ **39%** between 2021 and 2022



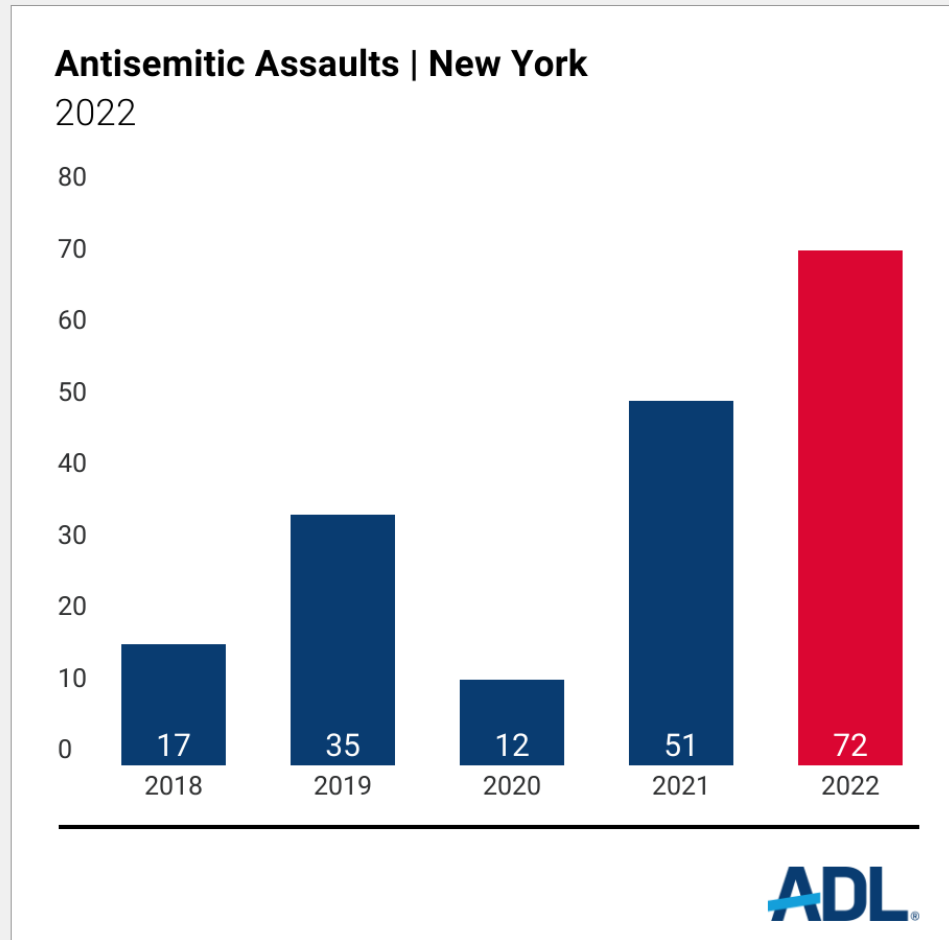

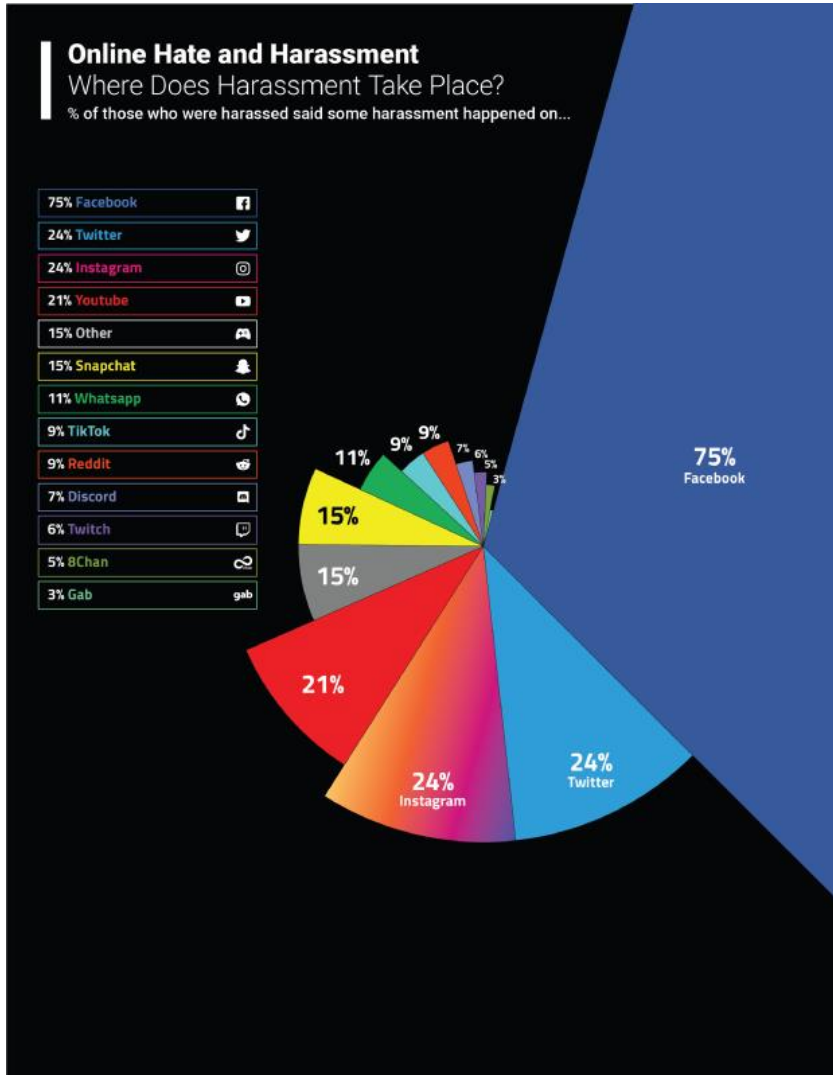
- Enact Legislation

What is S 895?

- Transparency bill similar to California's AB 587, signed into law by Governor Newsom last year
- Requires social media companies to post its terms of service and submit disclosure reports to the state Attorney General

Why is this important?



Clear policies

- Social media companies should have **clear and accessible policies** about online hate and harassment
- The reports would also include **changes** that companies make to their policies

Why is this important?



Reports we can read

- Reports should be **easily understandable**
- Published in a **central location** for the public

Why is this important?



Key metrics

- Reports will include how many users/groups were flagged for violations
- Disclosure of the number of actions taken and how the company responded

Why is this important?



Accountability

- Users will be able to see how companies agree to respond to online hate
- Data about online incidents will be public
