Report on the 2023-24 NYS Budget



Overview

- **\$229 billion total spending**
- **\$34.5 billion for School Aid**
- **\$1 billion for mental health**
- **\$500 million for safety-net hospitals**
- **Raised the minimum wage**
- **\$391 million for NYCHA/Section 8 rent arrears**

Education

- **Supporting New York's K-12 Education:**
 - Fully funded Foundation Aid
 - School Aid allocation of \$34.5 billion
- **Expanding Free School Meals:**
 - \$135 million to cover school meals
- **Bolstering SUNY and CUNY:**
 - No tuition increase
 - Increased operating aid by \$103 million for SUNY and \$53 million for CUNY by
 - \$50 million for transformational initiatives at CUNY






Environment

- **Climate Cap-and-Invest Program**
- **All-Electric Buildings Act**
- **Build Public Renewables Act**
- **\$400 million for the Environmental Protection Fund**
- **\$500 million for the Clean Water and Infrastructure Act.**

Health & Mental Health

- **Standing Up for Reproductive Care:**
 - \$100.7 million to fund abortion providers
 - Expanded access to abortion care for SUNY and CUNY students
- **\$1 billion Invested in Mental Health**
- **Supporting New Yorkers with Disabilities**
- **Strengthening Distressed Providers:**
 - \$500 million to support additional aid for distressed providers
 - \$35 million to support 340B funded entities.
- **Revitalizing Medicaid:**
 - \$1 billion in health care capital funding
 - 7.5% increase for in-patient hospital services and 6.5% for out-patient hospital services, nursing homes, and other providers.

Children & Families

- **Raising the Minimum Wage**
- **Strengthening Childcare Resources:**
 - **Implemented new comprehensive programs to ensure high-quality, affordable childcare**
 - **\$500 million for a Workforce Retention Grant Program**
 - **\$25 million to support the Employer Child Care Tax Credit.**
- **Expanding Child Tax Credit**
- **Lower Personal Income Tax**
- **Wage Increase for Agency Workers**

Rescuing the MTA

- **Adjusted the Payroll Mobility Tax on the largest businesses in NYC to 0.6%, generating \$1.1 billion annually for the MTA**
- **\$300 million in one-time State Aid to the MTA**
- **Required NYC to contribute \$165 million for paratransit services funding**
- **Reduced the proposed MTA fare**
- **Expanded service frequencies on the subway**
- **Created a pilot program providing five free bus routes in New York City**





Public Safety

- **\$347 million for evidence-based gun violence reduction programs.**
- **Cannabis Enforcement Powers of OCM and Dept. of Taxation and Finance**
- **\$30 million for Combating Hate Crimes and Anti-AAPI Violence**
- **Improving Criminal Justice Reforms:**
 - **\$160 million to support the implementation of discovery reform for prosecutors and defenders**
 - **\$50 million in capital for discovery technology improvements in New York City**
 - **\$92 million for aid for prosecution and defense funding throughout New York.**

Housing

- **\$40 million for the Homeowner Protection Program**
- **\$25 million for a First-Time Homeowners Program**
- **\$391 million to cover Covid-era arrears for NYCHA, other public housing authorities, private tenants, and Section 8 tenants**
- **\$10 million for eviction defense in NYC**
- **\$135 million in capital for NYCHA**
- **\$50 million for the Mitchell-Lama Preservation Program**

Some Local Wins

- **Tax credit for Off-Broadway theaters**
- **\$92.8 million of operating aid & \$20 million of capital for the NYS Council on the Arts**
- **Increased 18-b attorney pay & \$10 million for the Parental Representation Program**
- **\$63 million for immigrant services**
- **\$7.5 million for the American Museum of LGBT History & Culture**
- **\$1.43 million for the Holocaust Survivor Initiative**
- **\$1 million for NORCs**
