This poignant day remembers those we have lost to overdose, celebrates those who are in recovery, and supports friends, families, and those who continue to struggle with substance use disorder. Despite previous declines in fatal overdoses, the painful reality is that our local communities, state, and nation are experiencing a significant increase in fatal drug overdoses, which is a terrible tragedy. The Nopiates Committee is a terrific, non-profit, local organization addressing this trend with the goal of not only remembering lost loved ones, but also promoting awareness, prevention, and support.

The memorial procession turnout was vast and very personal (as evidenced by the messages of remembrance, hope, and healing on so many of the vehicles) reflecting the ongoing seriousness of this issue, and the fantastic work that the Nopiates Committee continues doing in Rensselaer County.


I also recorded a special audio message that was broadcasted on WVCR Radio, along with the personal messages of family members, for the memorial procession. Tim Murdick,


Celebrating the Chatham Fire Department being honored by FASNY

Amid the unprecedented challenges presented by COVID-19, the Chatham Fire Department successfully raised the bar in terms of attracting new recruits! Smartly utilizing social media and advertising via new mediums such as local movie theaters, the Chatham Fire Department demonstrated the continued strength, innovation, and community-centric approach of its recruitment efforts. Between 2019 and 2020, the Department had 7 recruits total, a 20% increase in the number of active firefighters in the Department. This is the second time FASNY has bestowed this award, and the first time that Chatham has received it.
