Happy Friday, and welcome to the September 18th edition my Weekly Wrap! Last Friday, I was honored to attend the Halfmoon 9/11 Ceremony to honor those we lost in the terror attacks. This week, I participated in the Questar III BOCES Zoom with Superintendent Gladys Cruz about the safety of our students, and the twenty percent cuts to schools proposed by Governor Cuomo, which I strongly oppose. I also teamed up with Senator Jim Tedisco and Assemblywoman Mary Beth Walsh to launch a new petition urging Governor Cuomo and the Department of Health to release the real number of nursing home deaths due to COVID to provide answers, ensure accountability, and better protect New Yorkers.

I'm also happy to announce that I'll be hosting a drive-thru flu shot clinic on October 3, at Columbia-Greene Community College. 

My New Legislation to Increase Penalties for Drive-By Shootings

Legislation introduced in light of the tragic shooting of 11-year-old Ayshawn Davis who was murdered during a drive-by shooting in Troy on

Sunday night

Halfmoon, NY – In light of the tragic shooting of 11-year-old Ayshawn Davis last Sunday night in Troy, New York State Senator Daphne Jordan (R,C,I-Halfmoon) has introduced legislation that would increase criminal penalties on drive-by shootings to first degree murder.

Senator Jordan's new legislation (Senate Bill S.8988) would amend the State Penal Law to establish a "drive by shooting" as being defined when a person, with the intent to cause the death of another person, discharges a firearm from a motor vehicle at another person outside of the motor vehicle.

"Our entire Capital Region was shocked and horrified at the senseless murder of 11-year-old Ayshawn Davis, a beloved child with a bright future. As a mom of two boys, I cannot begin to comprehend the Davis family's pain over this unspeakable loss. We send our prayers to the Davis family and want to see Ayshawn's killer receive swift justice," Senator Jordan said.

"My new legislation would increase penalties on vicious criminals like the one who murdered Ayshawn for committing the cowardly, heinous crime of a drive-by shooting. We have a duty and an obligation to protect the lives of families and especially children. In Ayshawn's memory, the state legislature should embrace my common-sense legislation and take bi-partisan action to do all we can to try and prevent future drive-by shootings and other senseless, violent criminal acts," Senator Jordan stated.

Notice from NYS Department of Transportation Regarding Lane Closures on the Northway

Watch for Lane Closures Saturday on the Northway in Saratoga County

The New York State Department of Transportation is advising motorists to watch for rolling left-lane closures in both directions on the Adirondack Northway (Interstate 87) between the Twin Bridges and Exit 9 in Saratoga County between 4 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 19, for pavement repairs.

The mobile work zone and lane reductions are scheduled to begin on the northbound side of the highway. Upon reaching Exit 9, work will proceed in the southbound lanes. Work and lane reductions are weather permitting.

Motorists are reminded to Move Over a lane, if safely possible, or slow down significantly whenever encountering roadside vehicles displaying red, white, blue, amber, or green lights, including maintenance and construction vehicles in work zones. Motorists are urged to slow down and drive responsibly in work zones. Fines are doubled for speeding in a work zone. Convictions of two or more speeding violations in a work zone could result in the suspension of an individual's driver license.
