# **LKQ Facility Tour**



Today, Friday, September 27, I toured the LKQ Corporation's (Like, Kind and Quality) facilities in Stuyvesant. Formed in 1998, LKQ locally employs 33 individuals and is the largest global provider of aftermarket and recycled collision parts. In terms of the company's global presence, they're currently located in 31 countries, with 1,700 locations, and 51,000 employees worldwide. Their impressive facility (that I'm pictured at here) processes approximately 65 cars per week. Last year, company-wide, they recycled 600,000 cars! The Columbia County facility that I toured earlier today saw \$18-\$19 million in revenue last year. My thanks to LKQ for today's informative tour!
