Prison officials to close 6 facilities in New York state

Gov. Hochul and the Democrat's procriminal policies are a public safety threat to New Yorkers. Failed bail reform has put more criminals on the streets than ever. Crime has increased drastically. Shutting down Correction Facilities is not the answer.

Albany must be responsible and establish necessary long-term plans for employees of these facilities instead of arbitrarily "turning out the lights" on unsuspecting public safety professionals and local communities. Officers hope doublebunking law slows prison closings

I co-sponsored this legislation (S.2211) preventing the double bunking of incarcerated individuals in correctional facilities. Why? Double bunking causes cells to be well over their designed capacity and makes it difficult for correction officers to observe an area, needlessly exposing them to increased danger. It also makes little sense from a public health perspective.

In terms of the alarming rising violence happening in our facilities – from the local Brookwood Secure Center to Rikers Island – the state needs to LISTEN to public safety professionals walking the corridors. Passing this legislation is one step in the right direction. But NOW, we need to stop the Cuomo-era policy of continually closing correctional facilities.



Honoring the life of U.S. Army Veteran Nathan James Snyder









On Monday morning at the Rensselaer County Honor-A-Deceased-Veteran Ceremony, we honored Nathan James Snyder, who very sadly passed away on October 20, 2018, at the young age of 23. The son of Linda Fryer and Timothy Snyder, Nathan was born on February 20, 1995, in Troy, NY and grew up in North Greenbush. After graduating from Averill Park High School in 2013, Nathan J. Snyder enlisted in the United States Army and served his country as an infantryman in Afghanistan.

U.S. Army Infantrymen are the backbone of the Army and serve in combat operations, including reconnaissance missions, and are experts in both weaponry and machinery, maintaining and firing combat weapons of all types. They must also know how to operate and maintain communications equipment, receive and

implement combat orders, and direct deployment of personnel in a number of different operation types (offensive, defensive, and retrograde). During combat, soldiers need to request, observe, and adjust direct supporting fire, and all of these tasks for the infantry are not possible without excellent communication skills as well as an advanced understanding of terrain, methods of warfare, and combat strategies.

Nathan was honorably discharged from Fort Campbell, KY on December 9, 2016. For his courageous service, he was awarded the Afghanistan Campaign Medal with Campaign Star, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal, Meritorious Unit Commendation, Army Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Army Service Ribbon, NATO Medal, Combat Infantry Badge, and the Air Assault Badge.

The New York State Liberty Medal is now also among those medals Nathan has received, as I was honored to present this to his family. The Liberty Medal is the highest honor bestowed upon an individual by the New York State Senate. May we honor and never forget the life of Nathan James Snyder, a beloved son, grandson, brother, uncle, and soldier.

On Wednesday morning I was very happy to join Hudson Valley Community College for the formal ribbon cutting of the Veterans Resource and Outreach Center, which houses the PFC Joseph P. Dwyer Peer Support Program of Rensselaer County. I was honored to present a NYS Senate Certificate of Recognition alongside Assemblyman Jake Ashby to HVCC President Dr. Roger Ramsammy. HVCC and Rensselaer County always make helping and honoring our veterans a top priority.

HVCC's VET-ROC (Veterans Resource and Outreach) Center is the focal point for all things related to the veteran and military-connected community on campus.

The Rensselaer County Dwyer Program offers peer-to-peer counseling for veterans suffering from PTSD or TBI and any veteran looking to reintegrate into civilian society. State funding for the Dwyer Program should not have to be fought for each year to be included in the State Budget. It is an effective and vital program for our veterans and it's an initiative that I've been proud to support and deliver funding for since my first days in the Senate.

I have continually advocated for FULL funding of this program along with Assemblyman Jake Ashby and have secured \$145,000 for Rensselaer County's Dwyer Program as part of the 2021-22 State Budget. The final enacted 2021-22 State Budget included \$4,505,000 for the Dwyer Program statewide, a true victory

for our veterans. Now, we must make this a regular part of the State Budget, and not a legislative-add or bartering chip.

Our veterans fought for us, now it's our turn to deliver for them.
