


### Record warmth, but snow on way to Capital Region, Adirondacks

ALBANY — The mercury should climb into the mid-50s again Friday but winter weather is not far behind. The National Weather Service in Albany predicts snow will hit the Capital Region and Adirondack Mountains on Saturday, potentially dropping up to 8 inches of snow around Glens Falls. ## My statement on Governor Hochul's new mask mandate



Governor Hochul's mandate raises many questions, especially regarding who would have the responsibility for enforcement — will it fall to employees at businesses? The \$1,000 fine also raises serious concerns as County Health Departments are responsible for enforcement. This constitutes a massive burden they can't oversee, as these departments already are incredibly busy and do not have enough staff.

The Governor's mandate adds yet another burden on our struggling small businesses, so many of whom have made herculean efforts to protect their customers and safeguard their employees. We need to expand COVID testing to help stop the uptick, as it would ensure that our small businesses are not forced to police their own customers.

Lost in the Governor's mandate is the critical issue of personal responsibility and choice, and that individuals can make the choice that's best for them and their personal health.
