## East Greenbush YMCA Summer Food Kickoff Event



### Rensselaer County CARES!

That was the strong, positive message delivered by my good friend Rensselaer County Executive Steve McLaughlin at Rensselaer County's 47th Summer Food Kick Off Event, hosted by the Greenbush Area YMCA Thursday morning.

I was proud to participate in, and speak at, this important event and stand with Rensselaer County Legislature Members Daniel Casale, Kelly Hoffman, and Tom Grant.

This fantastic event marked the start of the 10-week summer food program that runs from July 1 thru August 31 at locations throughout Rensselaer County. All told, there are 22 sites in the County where free lunches will be available The program ensures that kids have access to healthy meals when school is not in session, is free to all kids under the age of 18, and to persons with disabilities over age 18, who participate in school programs for the disabled.

The purpose of the Summer Food Program is to ensure that children ages 18 and younger have access to nutritious meals while the kids are out of school in areas of need, at no cost to them. Meals must be served where 50% of the children are eligible for free and reduced cost meals, as an extension of the National School Lunch and Breakfast Program provided during the school year.

Yesterday's successful kickoff event featured 120 great kids, as well as Valley Cat Mascot Southpaw, several members of the Albany Empire Football team, Cornell Cooperative Extension and the United Way.

The Rensselaer County Department of Youth has been a sponsor of the USDA/NYS Education Summer Food Program since it began in 1974, making this the 47th year in operation.

Last year, Rensselaer County successfully served a total of 23,828 meals during the 10-week program at 12 sites across Rensselaer County. This year, Rensselaer County anticipates serving 124,710 meals! That's incredible!!

Thursday morning's event also featured ice cream sundaes from Stewart's Shops. # Celebrating the new Resilience Garden at SUNY Empire State College



Thursday afternoon, I had the good fortune to speak at, and take part in, the special public dedication ceremony for SUNY Empire State College's beautiful, poignant Resilience Garden.

SUNY Empire's Resilience Garden will serve as a lasting symbol of hope and perseverance, marking one of the most challenging, painful, and trying times in our state and nation's history as we battled the COVID-19 pandemic.

Here's the inspiring backstory to SUNY Empire's Resilience Garden...

Last fall, SUNY Empire State College staff planted dozens of Asiatic lilies and gladioli at the entrance of 113 West Avenue, creating what is now the College's

Resilience Garden. The flowers celebrate the compassion and courage of the college community during the pandemic while honoring all New Yorkers impacted by COVID-19.

Yesterday's dedication event coincides with the July 6 reopening of SUNY Empire's physical locations throughout New York State. During the pandemic, SUNY Empire moved to a fully online model to serve its students and keep their goal of earning a college degree within reach. The College is now poised to resume its online, in-person, and hybrid-learning model.

The flowers (originally bulbs from her garden) were donated to the College by Lisa Johnson (who I'm also pictured with in these accompanying photos) a project coordinator at SUNY Empire, and symbolize the promise of new beginnings as we slowly emerge from the darkness of the pandemic.

Thursday's Resilience Garden Dedication was a terrific, celebratory event that I was proud to speak and take part in with Nathan Gonyea, Officer in Charge, SUNY Empire (whom I presented a NYS Senate Certificate to celebrate today's special occasion), Assemblywoman Carrie Woerner, Todd Shimkus, President of the Saratoga County Chamber of Commerce, Sue Epstein, Assistant Vice President SUNY Empire, and Elaine Caruso Roberts, Student Speaker.

I also learned yesterday that SUNY Empire also awarded \$225,000 in grants to over 900 students to help those financially impacted by COVID-19.


