I am proud to announce \$12 million has been awarded to projects in the 43rd Senate District and the new redistricted 46th Senate District, including PFAS removal at Algonquin Middle School in Averill Park, an Aeration Improvements Projects in

Rensselaer County, an Ammonia Removal Project in Saratoga County, the First Phase of Source and Water Treatment Plant Improvements in Schenectady, improvements to Battisti Water District 10 in Schodack, and the Second Phase of the Raw Water Transmission main project in Troy. Robust and modern water infrastructure is vital to ensuring the health and well-being of our communities.

Rensselaer County Locations NATIONAL PRESCRIPTION DRUG TAKE-BACK DAY



Turn in your unused or expired medication for safe disposal Saturday, April 30th 2022 from 10am to 2pm

Proper disposal of unused prescription and over-the-counter medications is important to protect both people and the environment. Unused prescription and over-the-counter medications that remain in the home can cause serious harm to people if they are taken accidently, intentionally misused or inappropriately given to someone else. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including the home medicine cabinet. Unused medications that are flushed down the toilet or poured down the sink can enter the water supply, harming fish and other wildlife and posing a potential risk to people.
