
New York State Town Clerks Associations 40th Anniversary

Kenneth became a dedicated member of the Columbia County Community, where he was a member of numerous community organizations including, the commander of Ghent VFW #5933, Ghent Marching and Concert Band, Chatham, American Legion Post 42, Post Commander of Rip Van Winkle Counties Council Veterans of Foreign Wars, Chairman of Columbia County Honor-A-Vet, Congressional Military Academy Selection Committee, Vice Chairman of the Columbia County Republican Committee, President and Chaplin of Ghent Volunteer Fire Company, Columbia County Volunteer Firefighters Assoc., Columbia Greene Community College Board of Trustees, and was a long time parishioner at Chatham Christ Our Emmanuel Lutheran Church. 
South Glens Falls Arbor Day Event

Turn in your unused or expired medication for safe disposal Saturday, April 30th 2022 from 10am to 2pm

Proper disposal of unused prescription and over-the-counter medications is important to protect both people and the environment. Unused prescription and over-the-counter medications that remain in the home can cause serious harm to people if they are taken accidently, intentionally misused or inappropriately given to someone else. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including the home medicine cabinet. Unused medications that are flushed down the toilet or poured down the sink can enter the water supply, harming fish and other wildlife and posing a potential risk to people.
