Rensselaer County Honor a Veteran Ceremony







Monday, Rensselaer County honored the life of World War II veteran, and longtime resident of Lansingburgh Joseph M. Spairana, Sr. It was my honor to present to his family a Senate Proclamation and a New York State Liberty Medal, the highest award a New York State Senator can present to individuals for exceptional heroic or humanitarian acts on behalf of their fellow New Yorkers and their community.

Mr. Spairana joined the Army in February of 1942 and was assigned to the 6th Armored Division, the "Super Sixth", as a crewman on a medium tank. Cpl. Spairana and the 6th Armored Division were deployed to the European theater and landed in Normandy in July of 1944. The Super Sixth would serve under General George S. Patton on his legendary drive across France and counterattack during the Battle of the Bulge. Cpl. Spairana would serve in Europe until February of 1945 when he was sent back to the United States.

After being discharged from the Army, Cpl. Spairana went on to raise three sons,

Jeffrey, Joseph Jr., and Jan, with his wife Josephine. Joseph Spairana continued to serve his community when he became the Director of the Rensselaer County Veterans Service Agency in the 1970's, and later as a Veterans Counselor at Hudson Valley Community College. He was also a member of the VFW, the Disabled American Veterans, a neighborhood commissioner for the Uncle Sam Boy Scouts Council, and a former Democratic committeeman in the City of Troy's 10th District. Joseph was also an active member of St. Augustine's Church, where he was a longtime member of the Bingo and Bazaar committee, and an usher for over 35 years.

Thank you to Joseph Spairana for your service to our Nation and State and for being such an active member of the community.
