Press Conference on the Two-Star Property Tax Relief Act

I am pleased to join my colleague Senator Jim Tedisco as a cosponsor on the "TWO-STAR" Act which would greatly enhance the STAR program. For those already receiving STAR and Enhanced STAR, the average annual benefit will double while also removing school property tax obligations for those New Yorkers

who are 80 and above that already qualify for Enhanced STAR. This commonsense measure is vital during these times of high gas prices and runaway inflation and will help average New Yorkers make ends meet. In addition, many of our seniors are on fixed incomes and may not be able to bridge the gap between their ability to pay and the assessed value on their homes, and this bill will consequently help keep seniors in their homes. There is a surplus of federal money in NYS and a priority should be made to help property owners, particularly our elderly property owners.


