Tuesday, I was honored to have my staff present a New York State Liberty Medal to the family of US Army Veteran Lawrence "Rex" Carney. After graduating from Stillwater High School, Lawrence enlisted in the Army in July of 1941. He was trained as an Anti-aircraft gunner and was deployed to the Pacific theater as an instructor in the Jungle Training Center. He was serving in the Mariana Islands when the United States dropped the atomic bombs that ended World War II.

When he returned home he married his beautiful wife Elizabeth (Betty) and together they had 4 children, Timothy, Patrick, William and Maureen. Lawrence worked for Westvaco and was a member of the Steamfitters and Plumbers Local No, 1905 in Schenectady until his retirement in 1983. He was also a member of the American Legion Post 409, the VFW Post 6328, was the former secretary and treasurer for the Stillwater Baby Ruth League, and a member of the Board of Director for the Mechanicville Stillwater-League.

Take a Bite Out of Lyme Challenge





Paul Puccio School at Maple Hill




