

Taxes and the Economy

I) Since we first enacted the property tax cap in 2011, it has saved property taxpayers \$23 billion. The cap limits the growth in property taxes to two percent or less.

2) For six consecutive state budgets, state spending growth has been restricted to two percent or below, saving taxpayers a cumulative \$41 billion.

The measure would also provide taxpayer-funded legal representation to immigrants facing deportation.
