Senator Alesi Ranked as Top "Pro-Jobs Supporter" by Business Council



The Business Council of New York State, Inc. (http://www.bcnys.org/ New York Guide (http://www.bcnys.org/whatsnew/2011/111011voters-guide.htm), which measures New York State Legislators' commitment to improving the state's economic climate and performance. I was pleased to be recognized as a top "Pro-Jobs Supporter" in the Legislature for the 2011 Legislative Session. Earlier this year, on behalf of Senate Majority Leader Dean Skelos, I addressed dozens of business leaders from across the state at The Business Council's annual legislative meeting, and since then, I have worked closely with Governor Cuomo and Lt. Governor Bob Duffy to take bold and decisive action to get New York State moving the in the right direction again and create a favorable environment for job-producing businesses to grow.

Each Legislator received a score reflecting their support for key business legislation during the 2011 Legislative Session including the following legislation (http://www.bcnys.org/voter-guide/index.cfm):

Responsible, Pro-Job Growth State Budget – The budget closed a \$10 billion deficit without raising taxes and eliminated a personal income tax surcharge.

Property Tax Cap – This legislation places a cap on the growth of local government and school property taxes at two percent, or the Consumer Price Index (CPI), whichever is less.

Medicaid Reform – Reduces Medicaid spending by \$2.8 billion and puts a cap on future Medicaid expenditures, taking the first steps to create a program that taxpayers can afford.

Recharge NY – A permanent program to reduce energy costs and taxes for small businesses and manufacturers so they can start to hire again.

Enhanced the Excelsior Jobs Program – To include expanded tax credits for the creation of new private sector jobs.

These measures will help move New York – especially Monroe County – in a positive direction toward economic growth, job creation and prosperity and I look forward to continue working with the Business Council and job-creating business throughout our communities.
