Senator Stewart-Cousins To Fellow Legislators, "What Can You Do For Others?"

(Albany - January 22nd) Senator Andrea Stewart-Cousins, the Senate Democratic Leader, spoke on a Senate Resolution she introduces annually in honor of civil rights leader Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and urged her fellow legislators this session to consider answering Dr. King's most persistent question, "What can you do for others?" The celebration of Dr. King's birthday coincides with the start of a new legislative session, when the State Senate begins its most important work, reviewing the Governor's Budget Proposal.

Senator Stewart-Cousins, a strong advocate for equal rights and opportunities, equal justice and service to others, urged her fellow legislators to consider Dr. King's challenge as a civil rights leader, a challenge that she says resonates even today. "We are all in the position everyday to do something for others," Senator Stewart-Cousins said to her fellow legislators on the State Senate floor. More..

Consolidate Primary Election Dates, Increase Participation in Electoral Process

(Albany - February 3rd) Following Assembly passage of legislation that would consolidate New York's primary elections, Senator Andrea Stewart-Cousins, the Senate Democratic Leader, has called for the Senate Republican Majority to bring this bill to

the floor for a vote. Currently, New York holds multiple primary elections for federal, state and local candidates and this unfunded mandate costs county governments millions of dollars as a result. Under Senator Stewart-Cousins' legislation, which is cosponsored by Senator George Latimer, all non-Presidential primary elections would be held in June and the resulting savings to county governments and property taxpayers would be \$50 million over a two-year campaign cycle.

"Merging primary dates is a common sense way to increase participation in the electoral process and save New York taxpayers millions of dollars," Senator Andrea Stewart-Cousins said. "I applaud my colleagues in the State Assembly, especially bill sponsor Michael Cusick, for passing this common sense legislation. Now is the time for the Senate Republican Majority to follow the Assembly's lead and finally end this unfunded mandate." More..

The Check Is In The Mail

For those who are eligible, and are still waiting to receive a Property Tax Rebate check, the Commissioner of the state Department of Taxation and Finance reports that the remaining one million checks will go out before the end of February. You are eligible to receive one if your income is less than \$500,000 and if the municipality that you live in stayed under the 2% tax cap. The amounts range from \$200 to \$800, with the average being \$350. The Senate Democratic Conference led by Senator Stewart-Cousins helped implement this tax rebate for homeowners.

EITC Awareness Day and Free Tax Assistance

January 29th marked the <u>Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) Awareness Day</u>, a nationwide effort to increase awareness about EITC and free tax preparation sites. In 2015, 27.5 million workers received about \$66.7 billion in EITC refunds.

New Yorkers are able to find out if they are eligible using the EITC Assistant and it is available in both English and Spanish. Visit www.IRS.gov/EITC to learn more and use the Assistant to help you find your filing status, determine if you have a qualifying child or children, verify if you are eligible for EITC, and estimate the amount of your credit.

Constituent Corner

Two weeks before Christmas, a 92 year old woman who lives alone in her home in New Rochelle contacted Senator Stewart-Cousins' District Office to report her boiler failed, and caused a flood. Her insurance company would only pay for the water damages. The Senator's Director of Constituent Services immediately set to work.

The woman who has lived in the same house for 60 years was unable to afford a new boiler. The office contacted the county's Department of Social Services, which receives state funding for its Home Energy Assistance Program, or HEAP. HEAP is a federally funded program that assists low-income New Yorkers with the cost of heating their homes.

The office learned the constituent could apply for assistance through New Rochelle's Community Action Program and HERR (Home Energy Repair and Replacement Program). Within a week, our New Rochelle senior had a new boiler installed. She now has peace of mind and a warm home once again.
