Making Safety Improvements at Lawrence Street Intersection with Saw Mill River Parkway in Ardsley

(Ardsley - April 21st) Changes in the traffic patterns of Lawrence Street was what brought the Department of Transportation on site, thanks to the intervention of Senator Stewart-Cousins, Westchester County Legislator Shimsky, Assemblymember Abinanti and Greenburgh Supervisor Feiner, and will be making safety improvements at the busy intersection with the Saw Mill River Parkway in Ardsley. The commitment came after local elected officials and community members met with a NYSDOT traffic engineer on April 21st.

Senator Stewart-Cousins' commended the DOT's response as a step in the right direction. The NYSDOT plans to make pavement markings on the Saw Mill in advance of the northbound Saw Mill at Lawrence Street, to indicate that the right lane is also the turning lane. Additional signage is also being considered. The DOT has scheduled the improvements to be completed in August. <u>More.</u>.



Teaming up with Red Cross to Offer Fire Safety

(Yonkers - April 23rd) Senator Andrea Stewart-Cousins, the Senate Democratic Leader, has teamed up with the American Red Cross to provide a lifesaving fire safety program that involves the installation of new tamper-resistant, long-battery life smoke detectors. Together, they have focused on helping at-risk communities, like southwest Yonkers, where there have been numerous fires. Senator Stewart-Cousins highlighted the effort during a news conference at School 13 in Yonkers. This initiative is part of a nationwide effort by the American Red Cross to reduce deaths and injuries from home fires by 25 percent over the next five years. <u>More..</u>

Fighting to Make College Affordable

(Albany - May 9th) The Senate Democratic Conference unveiled a policy package to reduce the costs of college and increase success rates in achieving a degree in New York State. The initiative, detailed in a white paper released titled 'College in New York State: Affordability and Success' presents solutions to financial barriers faced by New Yorkers seeking higher education and details a package of policy proposals for consideration to increase affordability, reduce student debt, and increase college success. This white paper was generated by the Senate Democratic Policy Group and is part of the Conference's overall mission to make New York a more affordable state to live, work, and raise a family.

"Education is the great equalizer in our society and we need to do more to ensure all New Yorkers are able to achieve, and pay for, a quality higher education," Senate Democratic Leader Andrea Stewart-Cousins said. "Too many men and women in our state have been denied access to a higher education due to financial constraints, or found that continuing their education was simply too expensive and were forced to enter the job market without a degree. Greyston identified a vacant lot that Max Braun, a family-owned meat and food processing company, agreed to donate. The garden is located at 94 Woodworth Avenue (corner of Ashburton Avenue), and will be known as the Max Braun Community Garden. The City of Yonkers helped clear the lot of brush.

Senator Stewart-Cousins thanked the community partners who came together to complete the project including: Food Bank for Westchester, Greyston, Groundwork Hudson Valley, the YMCA of Yonkers, Sarah Lawrence College and the City of Yonkers. "In time, this once vacant lot will become a valuable resource for those who contribute their sweat equity in the neighborhood," said Senator Stewart-Cousins. "We know that healthy eating including fresh produce is so important, yet it can be expensive. With our community partners, together, this urban garden will provide a sustainable and nutritious balance of food for the volunteers, right here in Yonkers." More..
