The "Made in NY" Production Crafts Training Pilot Program is a FREE technical skills training and job readiness program offered by Brooklyn Workforce Innovations and the New York City Mayor's Office of Film, Theatre and Broadcasting. They are currently recruiting for our spring class which will focus on training individuals interested in pursuing careers in the grip department. A grip is a technically skilled person responsible for the set up, adjustment and maintenance of production equipment on the set. A grip's typical duties involve mechanical rigging for camera and lights. This job requires extreme heavy lifting (70 lbs) and proficiency in mathematics & mechanics. Like all production jobs, it includes long hours and an irregular, freelance schedule.
