REFORM ALBANY UPDATE

The State Legislature must enact common-sense, fair-minded reforms that will bring about accountability and transparency to all our state government. In keeping with his strong commitment to reform, Senator Padavan signed on to the "Pledge for Change New York" a collaborative project of good government groups. Some of the proposals lined out in the pledge include: ensuring ethics, lobbying and campaign finance reforms are independent and powerful; providing an independent process for redistricting; and establishing an Independent Budget Office to oversee state finances.

CONTROLLING MEDICAID SPENDING WILL SAVE TAXPAYERS DOLLARS

New York's Medicaid spending has risen to a point that it is simply unsustainable. The facts are astounding. We spend an estimated \$1 billion a week on Medicaid for a total of \$52 billion annually. Future projections have state spending, your tax dollars, for Medicaid increasing by 37 percent over the next five years adding \$5 billion more in spending.

When you compare New York to other states the picture becomes even more troubling and stunning its scale and scope. Total spending in New York is 70 percent above the national average and spends more California and Texas combined. The Medicaid system is riddled with fraud, waste and abuse costing New York billions.

Senator Padavan has developed a plan that will save New York hundreds of millions in the short-term and billions into the future with some much-needed reforms to the Medicaid **program.** Some of the provisions in the action plan include:

- ► Authorizing the referral of all fraud cases to local DA's to streamline and increase the prosecution of cases and allow counties to keep a portion of the funds they recover;
- ▶ Restoring common sense asset and resource testing as a Medicaid eligibility; and
- ► Eliminating "doctor shopping" by requiring recipients to choose one primary doctor and one pharmacist.

FIGHTING FOR MORE JOBS AND A STRONGER ECONOMY

Several months ago, my colleagues and I in the Senate Minority Conference worked with small business leaders across the State in crafting a comprehensive proposal to improve New York's economy, cut taxes, and help create thousands of new private sector jobs. This groundbreaking plan, called the 2010 Job Creation and Retention Package, includes the following components:

A Cap on State Spending

Imposing a constitutional cap on State spending is one of the most critical steps we can take to improve New York's overall business climate.

Job Creation Tax Credit

An average \$2,500-\$5,000 credit to employers in New York for every new job created / only new jobs that expand total payroll. They would receive up to

\$3,000 in an additional credit for hiring a New Yorker on unemployment.

Moratorium on New Taxes and Regulations

Our plan would impose a moratorium on any new taxes, fees and regulations on small businesses, manufacturers and farms.

Perhaps the biggest missed opportunity in the State Budget was that it failed to address New York's most serious challenge — the need for economic growth and new private sector jobs.

In the days ahead, I will continue fighting for the key reforms set forth in the 2010 Job Creation and Retention Package, because it would dramatically improve our business climate and create thousands of new job opportunities.

PADAVAN HOSTS A SERIES OF NO-COST **MAMMOGRAPHY SCREENINGS FOR LOCAL WOME**

In April and June, New York State Senator Frank Padavan (Queens) and the American-Italian Cancer Foundation hosted a mammography screening event outside of Padavan's District Office in Bellerose. The nocosts screenings took place on the Foundation's fully contained mobile mammography van. There were no-outof-pocket expenses and no co-pays for both insured and uninsured women.
