FELDER HOSTS TWO EVENTS FOR SENIORS

Senator Felder recently hosted a blood pressure screening and a Reduced-Fare MetroCard event for seniors at his district office.

Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) personnel were on hand to assist constituents who wished to apply for a Reduced-Fare MetroCard or who required intervention with an existing Reduced-Fare MetroCard account. "A Reduced-Fare MetroCard can make all the difference to elderly people living on a fixed income," Senator Felder said. "It enables them to travel and maintain their independence without overly depleting their financial resources."

The blood pressure screening event was held in conjunction with registered nurses from Beth Israel Medical Center. "Early detection is a key factor in avoiding serious health problems later on," warned Senator Felder. "Everyone, regardless of age, should visit their physician regularly to ensure they have no underlying health issues," the Senator added.

CASES FROM THE FELDER FILES

Ain't Gonna Work on Saturday



Mrs. V., a Jewish woman in her 50s, had always worked on Saturdays as a lab technician in a Brooklyn hospital. But when Mrs. V. became observant, she notified her supervisors that she could no longer work on Saturday. Yet,

the hospital refused to accommodate Mrs. V. and continued to schedule her to work on shabbos.

Mrs. V. contacted her rabbi, Gil Frieman of the Jewish Center Nachlath Zion, for help. Rabbi Frieman asked three other elected officials to intervene on Mrs. V.'s behalf, but none of them would take on her case. Finally, Rabbi Frieman contacted Senator Felder who called the hospital administrator. Within 24 hours, the hospital reversed its previous stance and assigned Mrs. V. new hours to work which did not include shabbos or Jewish holidays.

FELDER PUSHES FAMILY TAX CUTS ACT

Senator Simcha Felder joined Republican Leader Dean Skelos and Conference members to unveil the Family Tax Relief Act, a package of tax relief and reform measures designed to provide a major economic boost to New York's struggling middle class families.

The Senate Republican plan would increase tax breaks that have not kept pace with inflation, and, in some instances, haven't been adjusted for more than 25 years. The plan also restores the STAR property tax rebate check program to provide real and direct relief to millions of New Yorkers who pay some of the highest property taxes in the country.



"For far too long, New York State has treated us like an ATM machine," said Senator Felder. "It is high time that we stop asking New Yorkers to withdraw their hard-earned monies and turn it over to the government to support our bloated budget. The Family Tax Relief Act puts money back where it belongs – into the pockets of financially over-burdened families – and sets New York on a good course to fiscal health."

The Senate plan would more than double the value of the Dependent Exemption; increase the Child Tax Credit and provide an additional \$500 child tax credit; increase the value of the Dependent Care Credit; and restore STAR property tax rebate checks.



We are pleased to report that in response to the snarling traffic along Avenue K, the Department of Transportation has notified Senator Felder that the signal timing on Avenue K between East 8th

and East I0th Streets and between East I2th and East I9th Streets has been modified. This will improve coordination with the signals at the intersection of Coney Island Avenue and Avenue K.
