

Dear Friend,

The warm weather is upon us and there are many exciting things happening in our State's capital and throughout the district.

First, I would like to announce that two pieces of significant legislation passed through the Senate Banking committee which will help stem the tide of Mortgage Foreclosures. The first bill would tighten the mortgage banker licensing exemption, helping to prevent and address problems resulting from unregulated residential mortgage loans which are not subject to existing consumer protections. The second bill would amend the banking law and the penal law, in relation to unauthorized entities, unregistered mortgage brokers and mortgage fraud.

I am also sponsoring a bill with Assemblywoman Barbara Clark to amend the transportation law, in relation to renaming the New York City Transit Authority Tack Safety Force and the New York City Transit Authority On-track Safety Program to the Daniel Boggs – Marvin Franklin New York City Transit Track Safety Force and the Daniel Boggs -Marvin Franklin New York City Transit Authority On-track Safety Program. Another bill that I'm sponsoring with Assemblywoman Michele Titus calls to amend the public housing law, in relation to granting tenants with a physically disabling condition that affects their mobility, a preference in occupying a vacant dwelling unit on a lower floor in the same building in projects operated by the New York City Housing Authority. All of these pieces of legislation are extremely important to the constituents in my district and I look forward to the passage in the Assembly of each and every bill

I would like to thank everyone who came out last week to my two youth town hall meetings. A panel of experts was on hand to discuss job readiness. Both town halls were a tremendous success.
