New York State Military Awards and Decorations



Medal for Valor

The Medal for Valor may be awarded to any member of the New York State Organized Militia who shall have dis-

played a conspicuous act of valor, heroism, courage or gallantry either in a military or civilian capacity. For more information on how to obtain an application to recommend someone to receive this award, please refer to the dmna.ny.gov website or call (518) 786-4520. The approving authority for this award is the governor.

The Conspicuous Service Medal

The Conspicuous Service Medal may be awarded to any individual who shall have distinguished themselves by exceptionally

meritorious service in a capacity of great responsibility. The service can be performed while in an active status by a member of the New York State Organized Militia, by a civilian in support of the New York State Organized Militia, or to other individuals who have provided support to the New York State Organized Militia and deemed appropriate by the Adjutant General. For more information on how to obtain an application to recommend someone to receive this award, please refer to the dmna.ny.gov website or call (518) 786-4520.

The approving authority for this award is the commander of each respective major component of the New York State Organized Militia.

The Conspicuous Service Cross

The Conspicuous Service Cross may be awarded to any current New York State or person who was a New York State citizen who

citizen or person who was a New York State citizen while serving on federal active duty; whose entire service was honorable subsequent to the time of receipt of the citation while serving in the U.S. Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard or in the Army female Nurse Corps, and who has received a personal decoration issued by a brigade or equivalent higher headquarters. The Conspicuous Service Cross may also be awarded to any citizen of New York State who, while serving with the allied forces, received a personal decoration published in order issued by a brigade or equivalent higher headquarters. The award of the Conspicuous Service Cross is based on prior award of at least one of the following military decorations:

- Medal of Honor
- Distinguished Service Cross
- Navy Cross
- Air Force Cross
- Defense Distinguished Service Medal
- Distinguished Service Medal (Army)
- Distinguished Service Medal (Navy-Marine Corps)
- Distinguished Service Medal (Air Force)
- Distinguished Service Medal (Coast Guard)
- Silver Star
- Defense Superior Service Medal
- Legion of Merit
- Distinguished Flying Cross
- · Soldier's Medal
- Navy and Marine Corps Medal
- Airman's Medal
- · Coast Guard Medal
- Bronze Star Medal
- Purple Heart
- · Defense Meritorious Service Medal
- Medal for Meritorious Service
- Air Medal

or as prescribed by New York State Military Law, individual was a Prisoner of War; served at Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941; directly participated in the D-Day Invasion of Normandy on June 6, 1944; or has been declared by the Department of Defense as killed or missing in action.


Conspicuous Service Star To whom awarded:

- Current New York State citizen, or
- New York State citizen while serving on federal active duty, and
- A current of former full-time military person serving in the Armed Forces of the United States or allied forces for purposes other than training since April 6, 1917; Active Guard/ Reserve(AGR) excepted, and
- Who is currently serving under honorable conditions or who has been honorably discharged from active duty.

The Conspicuous Service Star may be awarded to any current New York State citizen or person who was a New York State citizen while serving on federal active duty; whose entire service was honorable and who were recipients of a unit commendation arising from combat while serving in the United States Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard.

serving on federal active duty; or a non-New York State citizen who is an active member in the New York State organized militia and as an active member in the New York State organized militia, served with units of the New York State organized militia while on federal active duty for purposes other than training and/or annual training; whose entire service was

honorable and who were recipients of a valor, achievement, commendation, or meritorious service decoration, of a lesser degree than required for the award of the Conspicuous Service Cross, or whose service was in direct support of combat operations while serving in the United States Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard.

Replacing New York State Awards

To obtain a replacement for a New York State medal or ribbon, send a letter with proof that the medal or ribbon was awarded - normally the orders presented with the award or written proof that duty was performed to the New York State Awards Section at this address:
