SENATOR MAZIARZ OPENING STATEMENT

LET ME BEGIN BY THANKING ALL THE WITNESSES FOR

COMING, AND FOR BEING SO HELPFUL TO MY STAFF AND

ME IN ADVANCE OF THIS PUBLIC HEARING.

GIVEN THE HIGH TAXES AND ENERGY COSTS IN THIS
STATE, I BELIEVE THAT IT IS MY OBLIGATION AS
CHAIRMAN TO LOOK INTO ANY MATTER THAT WILL
MAKE UTILITY BILLS GO UP. NEW YORK STATE
CURRENTLY HAS THE THIRD HIGHEST ENERGY COSTS IN
THE NATION AT 19.12 CENTS PER KILOWATT HOUR
COMPARED TO A NATIONAL MEDIAN OF 11.92 CENTS.

WHEN YOU ADD THESE COSTS, TO SOME OF THE HIGHEST PROPERTY TAXES IN THE NATION, AS WELL AS RANKING NEAR THE TOP IN NEARLY EVERY OTHER CATEGORY RELATED TO OVERALL TAX BURDEN YOU HAVE A RECIPE

FOR DISASTER. IT IS NO WONDER THAT NEW YORK IS
LOSING ITS BEST AND BRIGHTEST AS OUR YOUNG
PEOPLE CHOSE TO LIVE IN OTHER STATES THAT HAVE A
LESSER TAX AND COST BURDEN AND ARE CREATING
MORE JOBS.

WHEN IT COMES TO THE BUSINESS CLIMATE AND THE INCENTIVES NECESSARY TO CREATE JOBS, NEW YORK IS ALSO LAGGING FAR BEHIND. OVER REGULATION, ALONG WITH OUT OF CONTROL SPENDING AND TAXES HAVE FORMED A TOXIC BREW FOR OUR ECONOMY AND OUR CITIZENS. IN FACT OVER THE LAST TWO YEARS, THE DEMOCRAT MAJORITY IN THE SENATE HAS RAISED TAXES AND SPENDING BY \$14 BILLION EACH, AND AT THE SAME TIME NEW YORK HAS LOST 245,000 JOBS. WHEN IT COMES TO ENERGY, MY COLLEAGUES IN THE SENATE MAJORITY HAVE ALSO BEEN ON THE WRONG TRACK. A PARTICULARLY OFFENSIVE TAX WAS THE

MASSIVE INCREASE IN THE 18A ASSESSMENT THAT I
OPPOSED, WHICH WAS PASSED IN THE 2009 BUDGET. THIS
ASSESSMENT RAISES THE FEE CHARGED TO OPERATE
THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION FROM 0.33% OF
UTILITIES REVENUE TO 2%. THE ADDITIONAL \$350
MILLION IN COLLECTED ENERGY TAXES WERE SIMPLY
SWEPT INTO THE GENERAL FUND AND USED TO FILL THE
GAPS FROM THE OUT OF CONTROL SPENDING THAT HAS
INFECTED ALBANY. IN FACT TAXES LIKE THIS 18A
ASSESSMENT MAKE UP 25% OF EVERY UTILITY BILL AND
COST CUSTOMERS \$50 MILLION A MONTH!

I MENTION THESE OTHER ISSUES, WHICH CLEARLY ARE
NOT THE FAULT OF NATIONAL GRID, JUST TO SET THE
PROPER CONTEXT FOR THIS HEARING. THAT CONTEXT IS
THAT UTILITY BILLS ARE TOO HIGH, ENERGY COSTS TOO
MUCH, AND IT IS OUR JOB TO MAKE SURE THAT

RATEPAYERS ARE PROTECTED FROM FURTHER UNWARRANTED COSTS.

OUR GOAL, HERE IS TO GATHER INFORMATION, AND TO PROTECT RATEPAYERS, NOT TO CONDUCT A WITCH HUNT AGAINST NATIONAL GRID OR ANYONE ELSE. AS CHAIRMAN OF THE ENERGY COMMITTEE, I BELIEVE STRONGLY THAT THE RATEPAYERS AND THE PUBLIC NEED TO KNOW WHAT HAS TRANSPIRED IN TERMS OF THE INAPPROPRIATE EXECUTIVE EXPENSES AND OTHER ITEMS THAT HAVE COME TO LIGHT AS A PART OF THE NATIONAL GRID RATE CASE, MY GOAL IS TO BRING ALL OF THE NECESSARY INFORMATION TO LIGHT SO THAT THE PUBLIC IS WELL-INFORMED ABOUT THIS ACCOUNTING SCANDAL AS WELL AS THE RATE CASE PROCESS IN GENERAL AND THIS CASE IN PARTICULAR.

I ACKNOWLEDGE AND APPRECIATE THE FACT THAT NATIONAL GRID HAS ADMITTED THAT THERE WERE ACCOUNTING MISTAKES MADE AND THAT CERTAIN EXECUTIVE EXPENSES SHOULD NOT HAVE BEEN INCLUDED IN THEIR RATE FILING. I ALSO UNDERSTAND AND APPRECIATE THE FACT THAT NATIONAL GRID, IS JUST AS BURDENED AS OTHER BUSINESSES BY THE NEGATIVE BUSINESS ENVIRONMENT IN OUR STATE, AND PAYS \$670 MILLION IN STATE AND LOCAL TAXES EACH YEAR WHILE EMPLOYING OVER 11,000 NEW YORKERS. I ALSO WANT TO COMPLIMENT NATIONAL GRID ON ITS EFFORTS TO PROMOTE ENERGY CONSERVATION AND GREEN TECHNOLOGIES. THIS IS INNOVATIVE AND NOT COMMON FOR AN INVESTOR OWNED UTILITY.

HOWEVER, NONE OF THESE FACTORS, HOWEVER
POSITIVE CAN MINIMIZE THE SERIOUS ISSUES THAT WE
ARE HERE TO EXAMINE. THE COMMITTEE NEEDS TO

ASCERTAIN, WHETHER THE ISSUE OF INAPPROPRIATE EXECUTIVE EXPENSES HAS IN FACT BEEN FULLY ADDRESSED BY THE COMPANY IN ITS OFFER TO REDUCE ITS RATE INCREASE REQUEST BY ROUGHLY \$4 MILLION. WE NEED ANSWERS AS TO WHY THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION BELIEVES THAT A DOWNWARD ADJUSTMENT OF ROUGHLY \$25 MILLION IS MORE APPROPRIATE IN THIS CASE. WE NEED TO KNOW HOW THE PSC DISCOVERED THIS PROBLEM, AND WHAT THEIR UPCOMING INVESTIGATION IS GOING TO LOOK LIKE, INCLUDING A SPECIFIC TIMELINE. FURTHERMORE WE NEED TO LOOK AT OTHER EXPENSES THAT NATIONAL GRID HAS NOT WITHDRAWN FROM ITS RATE CASE WHICH BOTH MYSELF AND THE PSC FIND TROUBLING.

WE ALSO NEED TO REVIEW THE METHODOLOGY THAT
WAS USED TO DETERMINE THE AMOUNT OF THIS RATE
INCREASE GIVEN THE VAST DISPARITY BETWEEN THE

\$369 MILLION INCREASE REQUESTED BY THE COMPANY AND THE \$14 MILLION DECREASE ENVISIONED BY THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION. WE ARE ALSO GOING TO LOOK AT WHETHER THE RETURN ON EQUITY REQUIREMENTS OUTLINED BY NATIONAL GRID ARE MORE OR LESS VALID THAN THOSE SUGGESTED BY THE CONSUMER PROTECTION BOARD. WE ALSO NEED TO GET MORE INFORMATION AS TO WHY UPSTATE ELECTRIC **CUSTOMERS ARE BEARING SUCH A HIGH PERCENTAGE** OF THE COST BURDEN FROM NATIONAL GRID'S SERVICE COMPANIES. ACCORDING TO THE PSC THESE CHARGES ARE ABOUT TWO TIMES GREATER THAN OTHER COMPANIES.

LASTLY, WE CLEARLY HAVE TO DETERMINE WHETHER
THE COMPETITIVE TRANSITION CHARGE WHICH WAS
PUT INTO PLACE IN 2002, IS STILL RELEVANT TODAY. IF
THIS CHARGE WERE ALLOWED TO EXPIRE AS
ORIGINALLY AGREED TO BETWEEN NATIONAL GRID AND

THE PSC, CUSTOMERS WOULD SEE A DECREASE IN THEIR BILLS STARTING IN 2011. IN THIS ECONOMIC ENVIRONMENT, IT IS MORE IMPORTANT THAN EVER FOR THE COMPANY AND THE COMMISSION TO EXPLAIN WHY THIS DECREASE IS NOT WARRANTED.

SO, IN SUMMATION, I WANT TO THANK ALL OF THE
WITNESSES FOR THEIR PARTICIPATION AND
COOPERATION. I LOOK FORWARD TO MAKING SURE
THAT RATEPAYERS GET ANSWERS TO THEIR QUESTIONS.
I WILL ALSO MAKE SURE THAT NO STONE IS LEFT
UNTURNED IN OUR CONTINUING EFFORTS TO KEEP
ENERGY COSTS AND THEREFORE ENERGY BILLS DOWN
IN THE STATE OF NEW YORK.
