Dear Chair Srinivasan:

I am writing in reference to the South Village Historic District (SVHD), and to urge you to schedule a hearing regarding landmark designation of Phase III of this district. As you know, in December 2013, the Landmarks Preservation Commission (LPC) approved landmark designation of Phase II of the SVHD, however it has taken no action on the proposed Phase III, which would extend the district southward to Watts Street. This final portion of the SVHD and the historic buildings contained within it are exceptionally vulnerable given development pressure from all neighboring areas, which was only exacerbated by the 2013 rezoning of Hudson Square.

Within the past year, both the State and National Registers of Historic Places recognized the importance of this area and listed the entire SVHD, as proposed in a 2006 report by Andrew S. Dolkart. I encourage LPC to act now to designate the proposed district's remaining, unprotected portion to forestall the destruction of its architecturally significant buildings which reflect the succession of distinct constituencies that settled there.
