## LEGISLATION TO SUSPEND HYDROFRACKING RECEIVES BI-PARTISAN SUPPORT

Balancing the energy and the economic needs of the state is always a high priority. On August 3rd, with my overwhelming support, the Senate passed S.8129-B, which would suspend the Department of Environmental Conservation's ability to issue new permits - until May 15, 2011 - for drilling a well that utilizes the practice of hydraulic fracturing in the Marcellus Shale formation. By putting the moratorium in effect, this will provide the Legislature with additional time to assess the true environmental impact this type of drilling would have on our water supply and air quality, environment, safety and public health.

## POTTER MEMORIAL NEW HISTORIC LANDMARK

The Potter Memorial property, at 53 West Church Street in the Village of Fairport, was designated as a landmark on August 6th by the Fairport Historic Preservation Commission. Before owner Frederick Potter donated the property to the village in 1943, he made a substantial portion of the property available for community Victory Gardens. Since then, the house has served as a community center, hosting countless activities, clubs and organizations for area residents. In 1945, a memorial to Fairport soldiers was dedicated at the northeast corner of the property. Today, that memorial remains as a permanent reminder of our Fairport and Perinton soldiers. This community is fortunate to have such a historical property as a village focal point.
