



I'm pleased to report that the recently approved State Budget includes restoration of \$30.6 million for New York State's EPIC program. My Senate colleagues and I fought hard during negotiations to include this funding to help seniors keep their co-pays under control.

Changes made last year to the EPIC program resulted in significant increases in co-pays for many seniors until the Medicare Part D coverage gap, or "doughnut hole" was reached. For our most vulnerable seniors, this change sometimes meant the difference between buying medicine or food.

Starting in January 2013, the funding I helped to secure in the new State Budget will ensure that most seniors will once again have affordable access to the vital prescription drugs they need with only modest co-pays. I will continue to fight for funding and programs that help seniors deal with the high cost of living on Long Island.
