I write to you regarding the contamination of the Dzus Superfund Site, Willets Creek, and Lake Capri in West Islip, New York.

Since our public forum on March 23, 2016, a plastic, construction type fence has been installed along Willets Creek behind the Ace Hardware Shopping Plaza to serve as a visible barrier to the contaminated areas. Unfortunately, this fence has been cut twice and individuals continue to have open access to Willets Creek. While no barrier is full-proof, and I understand that a greater physical barrier comes at an increased cost, I join many members of the West Islip community in advocating for a more substantial structure, such as a chain link fence, to be constructed in this specific location.

I truly appreciate all the positive steps that have been taken by the Department of Environmental Conservation to ensure that a timely and effective cleanup of these sites is properly completed once and for all. In closing, I respectfully request the Department of Environmental Conservation construct a more substantial fence in this area in order to prevent access to the contaminated soils, and thus, help ensure the continued health and safety of our students and children.
