






Poverty cuts lives short




Poorest ZIP codes in blue









Percent of adults who said their mental/emotional health was fair or poor






Longer-term concerns like aging are eclipsed by more immediate needs

Household Income Under \$25K


Household Income Over \$75K





Number of deaths per year










