Subject: Urgent Action Needed to Address the Child Care Assistance Program Funding Crisis

Dear Governor Hochul:

We are writing to urge you to take immediate action to address the growing funding crisis in New York's Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP), a critical program that helps working families access affordable, reliable childcare.

CCAP is designed to help low-and-moderate income parents stay in the workforce, pursue education, and provide their children with a safe and nurturing environment. Unfortunately, for many New Yorkers, the program is falling short. More than twenty counties across the state, particularly outside New York City, have already exhausted their CCAP allocations, leaving qualified families on waiting lists or being denied assistance altogether.

This problem is not due to a lack of commitment from local officials or families; it stems from a lack of sustainable state funding. The recent expansion of CCAP eligibility created a predictable increase in demand. Without a corresponding increase in funding, the program cannot meet its goals.

While the FY 2026 Budget included a \$400 million increase in childcare funding, the \$50 million allocated to counties outside New York City is far from sufficient to meet the scale of need. Delays

in distributing these funds have further exacerbated the crisis, forcing families to make impossible choices - cutting work hours, leaving jobs, or relying on unstable care arrangements.

When parents cannot access reliable childcare, businesses lose workers, local economies suffer, and children miss out on the early learning experiences that set them up for success.

As work begins on the FY 2026–27 Executive Budget, New York has an opportunity to stabilize and strengthen CCAP by:

- Providing sufficient funding to close current shortfalls;
- Developing a long-term, data-driven strategy to ensure funding keeps pace with demand; and
- Simplifying eligibility and streamlining the application process.

In the meantime, we urge you to take immediate steps to ensure counties can access the funds already allocated to CCAP so that this essential program can continue supporting New York's working families.

By providing adequate, sustainable funding and simplifying program administration, we can ensure every eligible family receives the childcare support they need to work, grow, and thrive.
