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Two Steps Back, One Step Forward

Coming into the year, New York State had every opportunity to be the climate and environmental leader New Yorkers expected.

It's an election year, and polls showed Governor Hochul comfortably ahead of the field. We have environmental leaders in both the Assembly and the Senate. The New York electorate wants the state to lead in the face of the Trump Administration's efforts to dismantle clean air, clean water, and public health protections.

Yet, even with these winds at her back, the Governor led the charge to weaken New York's nation-leading climate law; the Governor and the Legislature together ran one of the least transparent budget processes in recent memory; and the Assembly continued to punt on bills that would rein in our packaging waste crisis, remove toxic "forever chemicals" (i.e. PFAS) from everyday products, and replace dangerous lead pipes that supply drinking water to our homes.

But the news is not all bad: Governor Hochul and lawmakers appropriated \$1 billion for climate solutions through the Sustainable Future Fund, continued to invest in clean drinking water infrastructure, and supported the Environmental Protection Fund. While transformative policy languished, discrete improvements were made.



Why We Keep Score

Legislators hold powers that the New Yorkers they represent do not. Only a legislator can vote for or against a bill. Only a legislator carries the public platform that comes with the office – and the obligation to use it. The Scorecard is a record of how they used their platform. Rather than an endorsement, it is a record, compiled under consistent published rules from sources any New Yorker can check.

The 2026 New York Legislative Session marked the first time our state legislature retreated on the climate promises embodied in our 2019 Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (“climate law” or CLCPA).

New York’s CLCPA committed to boldly leading in the face of the climate crisis, using data-driven analysis to determine policy, investing in Disadvantaged Communities, and confronting climate with the urgency the issue demands.

Governor Hochul used all the tools at her disposal to strong-arm rollbacks to the law through the budget process, and both the Senate and Assembly signed off on the deal. The amendments were hashed out behind closed doors, without the expert input of the hundreds of scientists, community groups, labor leaders, or tens of thousands of New Yorkers that weighed in on the landmark 2019 climate law. This makes New York the only state, to date, to walk back its climate law.

In an attempt to provide accountability and shed some light on the dead-of-night negotiations, Environmental Advocates NY created a new scoring category on our Scorecard: the Oil Spill category. An “**Oil Spill**” is an action, agreement, or vote with a policy outcome that causes widespread damage – eroding hard-won protections, setting back progress, and creating disastrous long-term environmental consequences. Because the CLCPA rollback was negotiated behind closed doors without public or legislative review, for the first time ever, EANY considered legislators’ public actions to oppose the deal and defend the CLCPA as a part of their overall scores.

Our thanks go out to the 37 legislators who spoke out against the deal on several occasions, earning 3/3 points.

In recent years, meaningful environmental legislation has languished in NY, despite a desperate need for additional protections. In an effort to elevate key bills and hold legislators accountable for advancing them, we returned to a past practice with a new twist: **Superbills**.

2026: Transformative Superbills Fail, While Discrete Policies Advance

All four legislative Superbills failed to pass both houses to advance to the Governor’s desk. The \$1 Billion Sustainable Future Fund was included in the budget. The Assembly voted on none of the four non-budget Superbills. Despite having strong champions for each bill, and 77 cosponsors for PPRIA, none of these bills ever came to the floor for a vote. The average Assembly score, 59, highlights the body’s failure to meaningfully advance environmental priorities.

By contrast, the Senate passed 2 of 4 of our non-budget Superbills. Under Majority Leader Stewart-Cousins’ and Environmental Conservation Chair Harckham’s leadership, senators voted to advance the Beauty Justice Act and the Prohibiting PFAS in Consumer Products Act. The Senate’s average score of 75 sits well above the Assembly’s.

EANY is proud that 12 of our priority bills passed in both the Senate and Assembly this year. Among them were bills to impose a one-year moratorium on certain new data centers, standardize food date labels, authorize plug-in solar systems, and protect drinking water from PFAS. All these bills await the Governor’s signature (as of July 31st, 2026).

EANY teamed up with the New York League of Conservation Voters (NYLCV) to reconvene the Green Council – a group of multi-issue, statewide environmental organizations – to select a slate of priority legislation that is more heavily weighted in each organization’s scorecard.

The 2026 Superbills included:

- Lead Pipe Replacement Act (S.6892-A | A.7878-A)
- Beauty Justice Act (S.2057-B | A.2054-B)
- Packaging Reduction and Recycling Infrastructure Act (PPRIA) (S.1464-A | A.1749-A)
- Prohibiting PFAS in Consumer Products (S.9073-A | A.7738-A)
- \$1 Billion for the Sustainable Future Fund (Budget)

Special-interest lobbying spending in New York has ballooned in recent years. In January - April of 2026 alone, lobbyists raked in \$160 million, more than the same time period a year prior. Scoring System

Trees 🌲 & Smokestacks 🏭

Environmental Advocates NY reviews bills before the New York State Legislature and issues memos rating them according to their potential impact: the more beneficial a bill, the more points a legislator may earn (i.e., one-tree bills are beneficial, three-tree bills have major benefits). Conversely, the more detrimental a proposal, the more smokestacks assigned (i.e., one-stack bills are detrimental; three-stack bills have major detriments).

Points are awarded for correct environmental votes. Floor votes on all rated bills are tracked and totaled; weighted scores are then calculated for each legislator. Legislators who miss votes on more than 20 percent of scored bills receive a score of “Incomplete”.

Superbills

Legislators can earn up to a total of three points.

- **One** point for **cosponsoring**
- **Two** points for voting **yes on the floor**

Superbills are scored whether or not the bill gets a vote. Without a floor vote, legislators can only receive one out of the three possible points. If the Governor signs a Superbill, yes votes will receive two bonus points to their overall score.

Oil Spill Deal Scoring

EANY added a three-point climate-law advocacy category, awarding between 0-3 points for public actions opposing the rollback or supporting near- or long-term climate action. To learn more about the Oil Spill category, visit eany.org/oilspill.

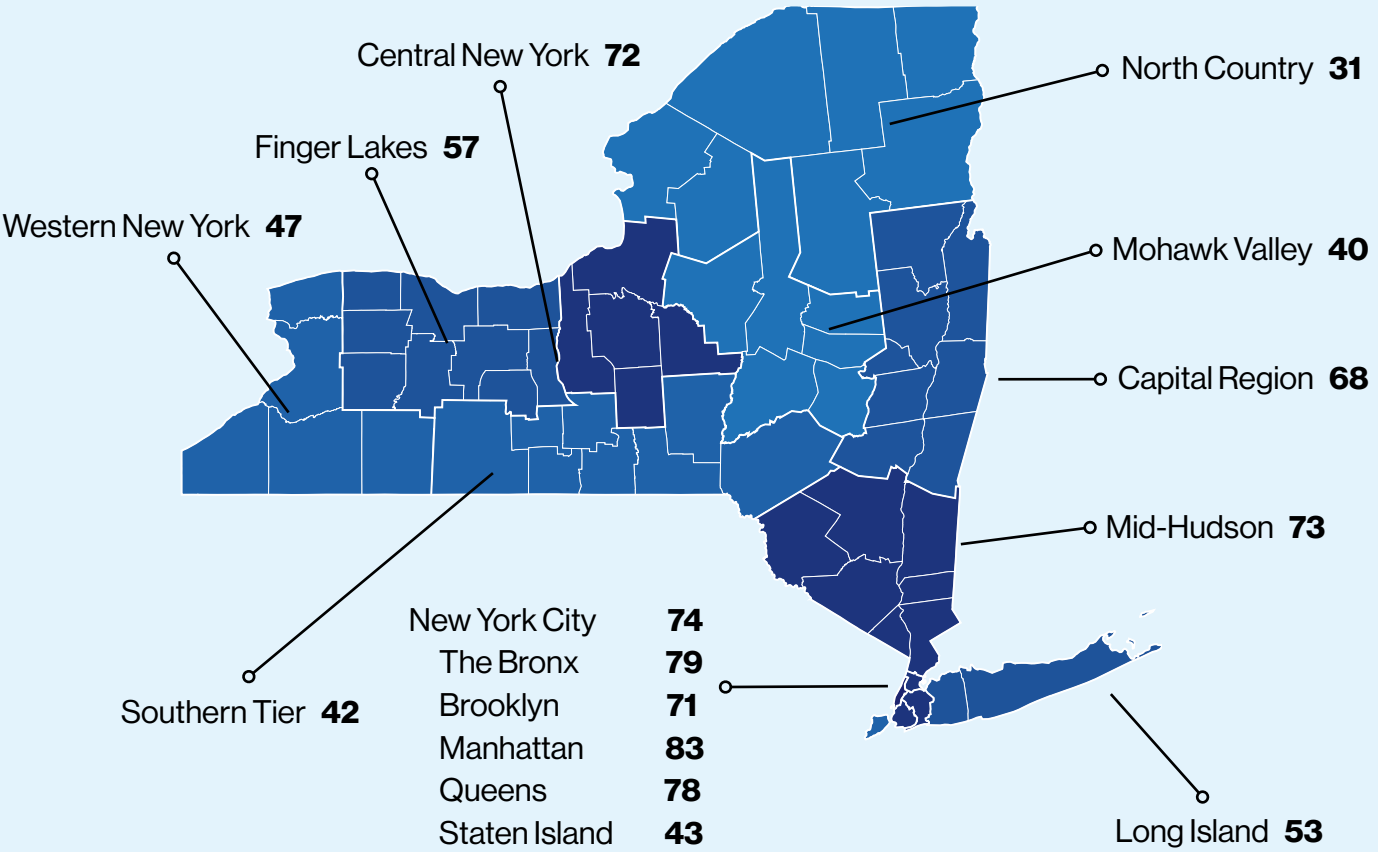

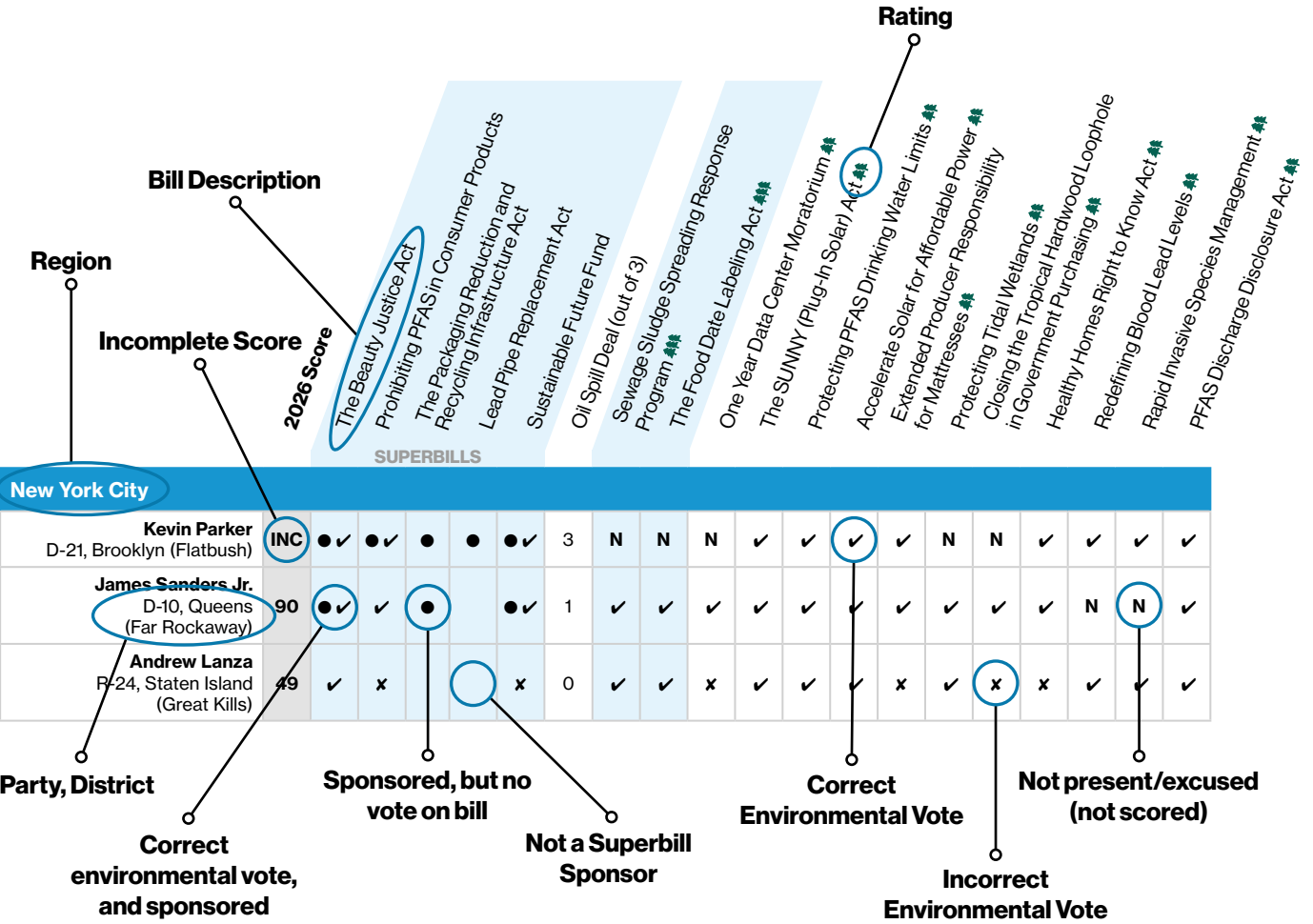
