ORGANIZATION OVERVIEW

Since 1993, Jumpstart has been helping children from underserved neighborhoods develop kindergarten readiness skills with a consistent track record of success. Jumpstart's founders believed – and we still believe – that providing equitable early education opportunities to children in underserved communities can help break the cycle of poverty.

Jumpstart's **evidence-based approach** has enabled us to remain effective and adaptable, consistently driving transformative change for young children year after year. Over nearly three decades, Jumpstart has trained over **60,400 college students and community volunteers** to transform the lives of more than **140,700 preschool children nationwide**.

HIGH-QUALITY EARLY LEARNING WORKS

Jumpstart envisions a world in which every child has the opportunity to thrive. Research supports the idea that high-quality early education opportunities, like those Jumpstart provides, can put children on a path to long-term success—increasing the likelihood they will graduate from high school, attend a four-year college, earn more as adults, and contribute positively to their community. However, not all children have access to these same critical opportunities early on. Centuries of systemic inequities have meant that children often have less access to the kinds of early learning experiences that contribute to school readiness just by virtue of the zip code they are born into or the color of their skin.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Direct Service and Workforce Development

40 hours of high-quality training and additional coaching throughout their service term. Teams of volunteers conduct twice weekly "Jumpstart sessions" and provide additional support outside of the session, enabling **more individualized attention for each child**. Jumpstart volunteers serve **a total of 200-300 hours** over the course of the school year. The foundational Jumpstart experience leads many volunteers into the

early childhood education (ECE) field. An overwhelming majority (84%) of recent Jumpstart alumni said the program deepened their interest in working with young children, with 57% reporting they would

seriously consider a career in ECE. Jumpstart believes an intentional, systemized focus on supporting volunteers' ECE workforce readiness skills will develop a diverse pipeline of early educators who are better prepared for the demands of teaching, more likely to remain in the field and who will provide a high-quality education experience for all children they instruct.



Community Programs:

Jumpstart expands the service of children from the school to the community through Community Impact programing. Through strategic partnerships with advocacy coalitions and CBOs like the NYC Reads Initative and City's First Readers, we serve additional neighborhoods through supplemental school year and summer programming, as well as through joint community events with partner organizations (i.e., Family Academy programs, literacy fairs, library events, park events etc.) Some regular programs include:







- Community Outreach events: Book Donations, Volunteer Engagement etc.
- Family Academy: Monthly family literacy and at home learning events
- Jumpstart Summer Program: 6-8 week In-classroom service during the summer
- Jumpstart for a Day

Policy & Advocacy

In order to drive systemic change in the early childhood field, we must also advocate for and champion policies at the local, state, and federal level. With **over 60,400 alumni** working in a variety of sectors including early childhood, Jumpstart is in a unique position to shape and inform the policy debate. Jumpstart focuses our advocacy on four key topic areas: accessible high-quality early childhood education; a professional, stable, and well-compensated early education workforce; affordable higher education that incorporates valuable workforce training opportunities; and a commitment to national service. Through engagements with elected officials, educators, families and higher education institutions and collaboration with NY city and State advocacy coalitions like Campagin for Children and The Empire State Campaign for Child Care, we support policy advancements that create true universality in early education systems.
