Dear Elected Representatives:

We have, as Commissioners, always felt that we are the ombudsman for the 2.5 million people of Long Island with reference to our parks system.

Obviously, each and every one of us were extremely upset when the news reached us of the closing of some of our parks and historic sites. We are quite aware of the serious budgetary crises that not only the State, but the local governments in New York and elsewhere face.

Nevertheless, we believe it is a serious mistake to "close" parks. We have reviewed the Budget Service Reduction spreadsheets and, while it does set forth a "net financial benefit", I believe it is inaccurate (a copy is enclosed). For example, closing Orient Beach shows a total budget savings of \$145,799.00, which includes temporary and non-personal service against the current revenue of \$74,560.00, leaving a net savings of \$71,239.00. It does not include any costs to maintain the Park. I am sure that no one is suggesting that the Park be abandoned. Maintenance still has to be done and security must still be maintained. Consequently, the net financial benefit plan is unrealistic and unfair and not calculated.

We believe that you, as the elected representatives, must take steps to save the parks and keep them open. The true dollar savings have not been shared with us and, in our opinion, are substantially less than contemplated by the budget submitted. We must do everything within our power and you are the ones to do it, to save our parks and keep them open.

Yes, we can curtail hours and "downsize" somewhat, but the parks should stay open for the benefit of all of your constituents.

Please let the Commissioners know how we can help you to keep the parks open.
