COMMITTEE JURISDICTION AND OVERVIEW

The New York State Senate Standing Committee on Cultural Affairs, Tourism, Parks and Recreation has legislative oversight responsibilities for issues concerning the State system of parks and historic sites, arts development, tourism initiatives, and advancing recreational opportunity for New Yorkers.

During the 2023 Legislative Session, fifty-eight bills were referred to the Committee for its review. Of these bills, twenty were reported from the Committee, twenty were passed by the Senate, and six passed in both houses. This work was conducted through three committee meetings. A list of all bills reported from the committee is provided at the end of this report.

COMMITTEE HIGHLIGHTS

The Senate Standing Committee on Cultural Affairs, Tourism, Parks and Recreation held three meetings during the 2023 legislative session. Additionally, Committee members met with the arts, parks and tourism community to continue funding important programs in the 2024 Enacted Budget, including historic New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA) support and Parks capital investments.

The committee reported multiple bills that would help preserve open spaces, foster historic preservation, and advance outdoor recreational opportunities for New Yorkers. S.809A, sponsored by Senator Serrano, formalizes penalties for illegal dumping and littering in State Parks. S.5345, by Senator Hinchey, increases the number of nominations that can be made to the Historic Business Preservation Registry. S.6124, by Senator Scarcella-Spanton updates boating safety standards for recreational vessels.

TWO HOUSE BILLS

In 2023, six of the fifty-eight bills referred to the Standing Committee on Cultural Affairs, Tourism, Parks and Recreation passed both houses of the Legislature.
