COMMITTEE JURISDICTION AND OVERVIEW

The New York State Senate Standing Committee on Health has legislative oversight responsibilities for issues concerning a broad range of issues, including the general operation of healthcare facilities and the delivery of healthcare services to those within our state. This year the committee advanced a number of measures to address important issues including lead poisoning prevention, funding for distressed hospitals, Medicaid eligibility and services, organ donation, pharmaceutical pricing, and many others.

During the 2023 Legislative Session, 480 bills were referred to the Committee for its review. Of these bills, 149 were reported from the Committee; 92 were passed by the Senate; and 49 passed in both houses. This work was conducted through a series of nine committee meetings. A list of all bills that were reported from the committee is provided at the end of this report.

In addition to its regular meetings, the Committee held one hearing on the proposed SFY 2023-24 budget and three roundtable meetings on the Healthcare Workforce in the Southern Tier, Monroe County, and Erie County.

COMMITTEE HIGHLIGHTS

The following key bills were acted on by the committee in 2023:

Essential Plan

- Coverage for All: Expands Eligibility for the Essential Plan (S2237-A Rivera Passed Senate)
 - Provides eligibility for services under the basic health program for individuals whose immigration status renders him or her ineligible for federal financial participation and who meet additional requirements.

Medicaid Services

- Provides Automatic Enrollment and Recertification for Medicaid Eligible Recipients (S4622-A Rivera - Committed to Finance)
 - Provides for automatic enrollment and recertification simplification for Medicaid managed care plans and long-term care plans.
- Repeals Limitations on Eligibility for Person Care Services (S328 Rivera -Committed to Finance)
 - Eliminates the requirement that applicants for personal care services need assistance with multiple activities of daily living in order to qualify.
 This language was included in the Senate one-house budget proposal.
- Expanding Eligibility for Long-Term Home Care (S2125 Rivera Passed Senate)
 - Modifies the "look-back period" for the determination of eligibility of an individual for medical assistance benefits to exempt certain assets used on the individual's behalf or for care services provided to the individual by a family member or informal caregiver.
- Services for Individuals with Traumatic Brain Injuries and Nursing Home Diversion Waivers (S2867 Rivera - Passed Senate)
 - Provides that services to medical assistance recipients suffering from traumatic brain injuries or qualifying for nursing home diversion and transition services shall be provided outside of managed programs.

Medical Debt

- Establishes the Ounce of Prevention Act (S1366 Rivera Committed to Rules)
 - Requires the Department of Health establish a single uniform financial assistance policy that all hospitals would use to facilitate the provision of financial aid as a condition of participation in the indigent care pool fund (ICP) to expand the eligibility and protections available through financial assistance.
- The Fair Medical Debt Reporting Act (S4907 Rivera Chapter 727 of 2023)
 - Prohibits hospitals, medical providers, or ambulance services from providing adverse information about medical debt to consumer reporting agencies.

Lead Poisoning Prevention

- Establishes the Lead Pipe Right to Know Act (S5512 Rivera Chapter 730 of 2023)
 - Makes information about the number and location of lead pipes easily accessible to the public and decision-makers, so that state and federal resources can be secured and efficiently targeted to support local efforts to get the lead out of New York's drinking water by removing all lead pipes.
- Potable Water Testing at State and Local Parks (S147-A Gianaris Passed Senate)
 - Establishes standards for the testing of potable water in state and local parks and makes the results of such testing publicly accessible.

Asthma

- Relates to Coverage for the Treatment of Asthma (S4889 Rivera Passed Senate)
 - Ensures that every health insurance policy includes coverage for the equipment and supplies for the treatment of asthma and for children under 19 years of age, as well as additional equipment and supplies for use in school, if recommended or prescribed.

Addressing Substance Use Disorder

- Enacts The Safer Consumption Services Act (S399-A Rivera Committed to Finance)
 - Authorizes the state and localities to establish overdose prevention centers to support individuals with substance use disorder by providing education, bridges to addiction treatment and social welfare services, and emergency medical treatment if needed.

Maternal-infant Care Centers (S266-A Rivera - Veto 123)

 Requires that the New York State Department of Health in conjunction with the Office of Alcohol and Substance Abuse Services to establish a pilot program of at least four maternal-infant care centers in areas of need in the state.

Organ Donation

- Authorizes Medicaid Payment for Kidney Transplants to Undocumented New Yorkers (S3577 Rivera - Committed to Finance)
 - Grants Medicaid eligibility for kidney transplant expenses to residents of New York State with end-stage renal disease who are otherwise eligible for benefits except for their immigration status.

Nutrition Education

- Establishes the Sweet Tooth Act (S6408-A Rivera Committed to Finance)
 - Requires chain restaurants to display an added sugars warning next to or directly under the name of each food item with high added sugars content wherever such food item is listed on a menu.
- Added Sodium Bill (S4890 Rivera Passed Senate)
 - Requires chain restaurants to place an icon on menus next to food items that have a high content of sodium, which indicates that the sodium content of this item is higher than the total daily recommended limit of 2300mg.
- Protecting Children From False Misleading Advertisements (S213-B Myrie -Passed Senate)
 - Relates to false or misleading advertisements of food and food products; provides factors to determine whether an advertisement is false or misleading; provides for enforcement and a private right of action.

Distinct Patient Needs

- Establishes a neurodegenerative with behaviors enhanced special needs assisted living residence (S2161-A Rivera - Veto 100 of 2023)
 - Establishes a special needs assisted living program to serve residents of certified assisted living residences with neurodegenerative diseases, such as dementia or Parkinson's disease, who are experiencing behavior disturbances.
- Establishes the "Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender Long-Term Care Facility Residents' Bill of Rights (S1783 Hoylman-Sigal - Chapter 682 of 2023)
 - Establishes the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender, and people living with HIV long-term care facility residents' bill of rights; prohibits a longterm care facility or facility staff from discriminating against any resident on the basis of such resident's actual or perceived sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, or HIV status.

TWO HOUSE BILLS

In 2023, 49 of the 480 bills referred to the Standing Committee on Health passed both houses of the Legislature. Of these bills, the Governor has signed 24 and vetoed seven. Of the remaining bills,18 are on the Governor's Desk.
