# 2017 Rules Committee Report

## Senator John Flanagan, Chair

The Rules Committee reported 987 bills from committee this session. A total of 987 bills advanced to Calendar, 44 of which died on 3rd Reading Calendar, while 611 bills passed the Senate only and 332 bills passed both Houses.

- **S. 592B PERALTA** -- Directs the city department of health and mental hygiene to establish a grading system to classify the result of an inspection of mobile food service establishments and pushcarts in cities over 1 million
- **S. 602 BOYLE** -- Creates "Robin's law"; relates to mental health and chemical dependence outpatient treatment of sex offenders
- **S. 616 BOYLE** -- Provides that people arrested in connection with felonies relating to sex offenses where the victim is less than 13 years old must submit a DNA sample
- **S. 623 BOYLE** -- Relates to criminal sale of a controlled substance
- **S. 643 BOYLE** -- Relates to protecting registered security guards in a hospital or health care facility from assault; class D felony
- **S. 656 BOYLE** -- Validates certain acts of the Islip Union Free school district with regard to certain capital improvement projects
- **S. 677 DEFRANCISCO** -- Relates to certain affirmative defenses available under the labor law
- **S. 689 ORTT** -- Provides an asbestos remediation tax credit

- **S. 1178 MARCELLINO** -- Creates the crime of aggravated criminal conduct where an individual commits a misdemeanor and has been previously subjected to four or more qualifying misdemeanors
- **S. 1186 MARCELLINO** -- Requires notification to victims upon the conditional release of an inmate convicted of a crime against a member of the same family or household
- **S. 1187 MARCELLINO** -- Relates to the number of prior suspensions needed to qualify for aggravated unlicensed operation in the first degree
- **S. 1195 AVELLA** -- Establishes the payment of certain volunteer firefighter and volunteer ambulance worker death benefits shall be within ninety days of the filing of application to receive such death benefit
- **S. 1196 AVELLA** -- Relates to recycling program requirements
- **S. 1207 FLANAGAN** -- Eliminates the expiration of and makes permanent provisions of law establishing the property tax cap
- **S. 1211 ORTT** -- Relates to disallowing sentences of intermittent imprisonment when the court is imposing a sentence for a sex offense
- **S. 1220 ORTT** -- Relates to exempting tension pneumothorax decompression needles from criminal possession of a hypodermic instrument
- **S. 1236 VALESKY** -- Regulates the sale of methamphetamine precursor drugs
- **S. 1237 VALESKY** -- Authorizes state agencies to publish certain rule making notices by electronic means
- **S. 1238 ORTT** -- Relates to aggravated harassment of an employee by an inmate
- **S. 1240 VALESKY** -- Allows the New York state thruway authority to provide a discounted toll rate to farmers transporting agricultural products
- **S. 1246 VALESKY** -- Directs the commissioner of health to establish and maintain an electronic database, accessible to the public, of known synthetic cannabinoids
- **S. 1248 AKSHAR** -- Establishes a second office of judge of the county court in the county of Chenango
- **S. 1249 AKSHAR** -- Eliminates the expiration of and makes permanent, provisions of law authorizing an individual to fish with up to 3 lines in freshwater
- **S. 1257 MARCELLINO** -- Prohibits the use of a hands-free mobile telephone by operators of motor vehicles who hold a learner's permit or a class DJ or MJ license
- **S. 1258 MARCELLINO** -- Changes one of the elements of aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle in the second degree to require two or more suspensions in certain cases
- **S. 1259 MARCELLINO** -- Relates to the offense of unauthorized use of a vehicle in third degree
- **S. 1261 MARCELLINO** -- Provides that a motor vehicle will be considered to be in motion while stopped at traffic control devices and stop signs for purposes of mobile phones and other portable electronic devices

- **S. 1266 AVELLA** -- Abolishes the minimum charge for the supply of water by the New York city municipal water finance authority and the New York city water board
- **S. 1280 ORTT** -- Relates to building aid forgiveness
- **S. 1289 AVELLA** -- Requires a study to evaluate the costs associated with the provision of child day care services
- **S. 1292 MARCELLINO** -- Establishes the crime of terrorism recruitment, a class C felony
