Dear Senator Flanagan:

It is my pleasure to submit the annual report of the Senate Standing Committee on Higher Education for the 2018 legislative session. The committee maintained its commitment to supporting and examining ways to bolster New York's higher education sectors, as well as its oversight of the various professions licensed or seeking licensure by the State Education Department.

The most significant topics discussed by the committee throughout the session were restoring and enhancing maintenance of effort provisions (S.759-A) and enacting a five-year capital plan (S.7236) for the State University of New York (SUNY) and City University of New York (CUNY). For a third time, both bills passed both houses and were sent to the Governor for his signature. The Maintenance of Effort provisions bill (S.759) has not yet been delivered to the Governor. The bills provide proper operating and capital funding to our public university systems, and also provide coverage for the TAP gap.

Several other significant higher education bills were enacted throughout the session. Chapter 301, sponsored by Senator Golden, extended provisions allowing foreign dental faculty to receive restricted licenses in New York State. Chapter 67, also sponsored by Senator Golden, extended provisions allowing tuition waivers for police officer students at CUNY to take one course free of charge as long as such course relates to their occupation. Chapter 147, sponsored by Senator DeFrancisco, allows for provisional permits for clinical laboratory technology, which resolved a longstanding issue with the field and updated the law to create better continuity in the profession.

The 2018-2019 enacted budget saw several significant developments. The new chargeback methodology was repealed, which, if implemented, would have caused significant funding problems for community colleges in the state. The Senate also fought for important restorations for SUNY senior colleges, and SUNY stayed level at a \$550 million investment for critical maintenance projects. Community college base aid also saw a \$100 increase per full time equivalent (FTE), which provided for a total of \$12.06 million in additional aid. The Senate also doubled the aid for SUNY for increased access to mental health services to \$600,000. The

Senate also fought to end the entity exemption for certain state agencies concerning unlicensed professionals in the mental health field, and was successful after 16 years.

The Governor signed several bills related to the licensed professions. These include extending certain provisions of law relating to physical therapy assistants, pushing out the effective date for the licensure of pathologists' assistants, and creating uniformity for the New York State Dental Association's counting of membership so they are in conformity with the American Dental Association. A total of 8 out of 15 bills reviewed by the committee were signed by the Governor thus far.

I thank the committee for its continued support and commitment throughout the 2018 legislative session. I remain dedicated to ensuring that New York State higher education is the best in the nation and look forward to working with the committee members and the entire Senate on the various issues affecting higher education in the state.

COMMITTEE JURISDICTION

The Senate Higher Education Committee is charged with the review and development of legislation addressing postsecondary education for New York State. This includes legislation dealing with the Board of Regents as well as more than 50 professions licensed by the State Education Department.

The committee's jurisdiction, therefore, covers a broad range of areas including maintaining the quality of New York's public, proprietary and independent colleges and universities, continuing the state's long tradition of providing the nation's most generous student financial aid programs, and providing institutional aid to all sectors of higher education. In addition, the committee plays a key role in program quality, access and opportunities for professional education, encourages academic and private sector cooperation, promotes research, and facilitates elementary and postsecondary partnerships. Furthermore, the committee is deeply involved with the process by which practitioners acquire, demonstrate and maintain professional skills. A major component of the committee's work is to consider change and expansion to the scope of practice of the state's professions, as well as to consider the licensure of newly created professions.

Another important responsibility of the committee is to consider gubernatorial and mayoral nominations to the various boards, task forces and work groups within the higher education community.

MAINTENANCE OF EFFORT AND 5-YEAR CAPITAL PLAN FOR SUNY AND CUNY

A major highlight of the 2018 legislative session was the advocacy for enhanced maintenance of effort (MOE) provisions and establishing a 5-year capital plan for the State University of New York (SUNY) and City University of New York (CUNY) systems. Both MOE (S.7259-A) and the 5-year capital plan (S.7236) were important initiatives put forth with bipartisan support of both the Senate and Assembly.

When NYSUNY 2020 was first established in 2011, a maintenance of effort provision was enacted that would require the Governor to support both the SUNY and CUNY university systems at levels no less than the prior fiscal year. Both SUNY and CUNY had been recovering from cuts and unpredictable levels of funding. This original legislation was an agreement that the state, the public colleges, and the students would share in the goal of driving increased funding into the State higher education system. At that point, tuition increases were enacted that would total \$1,500 per student over five years. The intention was that these increases would then be matched by a proper investment by the state through the maintenance of effort provisions. This ensured that no cuts could be made to the SUNY and CUNY systems unless there was a fiscal crisis.

However, as the tuition burden increased on the students, the state did not keep its commitment to maintenance of effort because the Governor and the Legislature disagreed on what should be funded under this initiative. The Legislature advocated for the inclusion of all collective bargaining costs, any mandatory costs, utility costs, costs incurred by the SUNY university hospitals and fringe benefits in this provision. Due to this disagreement, the Legislature introduced legislation that stated this intention clearly in 2015. That legislation passed both houses, and was sent to the Governor. Unfortunately, the Governor vetoed both bills.

The maintenance of effort provision was set to expire in 2016, and during the 2016-2017 budget, there was no resolution to this issue. The provision was allowed to expire. During the 2017-2018 budget, the Legislature was successful in restoring the original maintenance of effort provisions again for another four years. However, this provision matched the language in 2011, with the addition of covering fringe benefits, and the gap created by the Excelsior Scholarship.

After the conclusion of the state budget negotiations last year, a version of MOE, S.1596-A, was introduced to provide for more robust maintenance of effort provisions, along with the companion bill for 5-year capital plans, S.1625, that also provided for predictable capital funding for the two university systems over five years. The Legislature was able to pass these two pieces of legislation with unanimous support through both houses, again signaling the need for proper state operating and capital funding. Unfortunately, despite the Legislature's efforts, the Governor again vetoed both bills.

In the 2018 legislative session, MOE and 5-year capital plan legislation was introduced again. MOE had one significant change made, which would include covering the funding for the "TAP gap." The TAP gap was created by an increase in tuition costs and the allotment for a full TAP award staying static. This has produced a funding gap for both the SUNY and CUNY systems, and is something that should be considered a mandatory cost covered under maintenance of effort provisions.

Both of these bills are critically important. Without proper investment in the human capital component in the form of full-time faculty, students will have a harder time getting the proper class offerings and the percentage of students completing on time will decrease. With the enactment of the Excelsior Scholarship and its goal of incentivizing on-time completion, it is hard to ignore the ramifications of the lack of commitment by the state toward a robust maintenance of effort provision.

2018-2019 ENACTED BUDGET

The 2018-2019 enacted budget included important measures for the private sector in New York State. The Enhanced Tuition Award (ETA) Program was amended with significant changes to increase participation rates. These changes included allowing a college's match to come out of an existing financial aid award package, allowing any college that reduced its tuition by greater than 15% to be exempt from providing a match for the next three years, and allowing proprietary colleges to be eligible to participate in the program. Furthermore, Bundy Aid was preserved at \$35 million after being cut in the Executive Budget, and another round of Higher Education Capital Matching Grants (HECap) Program was funded at \$30 million. The Legislature also was able to include the private colleges in the STEM Incentive Scholarship Program, and \$4 million was allocated for new cohorts of students attending private colleges over the next 4 years.

SUNY capital funding also saw important restoration to prior year levels for critical maintenance. \$350 million was designated for critical maintenance for senior colleges, and the Legislature restored \$200 million in cuts to critical maintenance. An additional \$100 million was allocated for capital for Upstate and Stony Brook Hospitals. CUNY capital funding was restored at prior year levels. Further, the Legislature worked with the Executive to restore important operating funding to the SUNY University Hospitals, after their funding was redirected to the capital budget in the Executive's proposal. The SUNY hospitals will now be able to access \$92 million in CREP funding, a federal grant program, and the state will pay the debt service for all SUNY hospitals for the next fiscal year.

Community colleges received an increase in state operating aid for the seventh consecutive year. The increase of \$100 in base aid per full-time equivalent (FTE) brought base aid to \$2,847 per FTE. Additionally, the budget provided \$1.5 million for the Graduate Achievement Program (GAP), \$1.5 million for Small Business Development Centers, and over \$1.5 million for SUNY and CUNY childcare centers. The Legislature also repealed the new chargeback methodology, which would have created significant problems in relation to funding for both SUNY and CUNY community colleges.

A few important measures were also enacted in relation to the State Education Department and the Title VII professions. The State Education Department (SED) gained authorization to access funds to create an Electronic Licensing System (E-Licensing) for the Title VIII professions. Authorization for SED to access funds to continue providing institutional accreditation services for institutions of higher education through New York was also granted in this budget. After 16 years, the Legislature was able to drive the discussion to end the entity exemption for social workers, psychologists, licensed masters mental health professionals, and create a permanent solution to this fraught issue. This exemption authorized unlicensed individuals to provide mental health, social work and psychological services in certain entities, and the modified proposal further clarified what tasks are protected under certain scopes of practices, as well as what tasks can be performed by unlicensed individuals. After working with the Executive, the affected state agencies, and many professional and advocacy groups, a solution was reached. The Legislature modified the Executive proposal by ending the exemption one year after SED issued formal guidance to the agencies after consultation on such guidance, including reporting

requirements, and added a legislative intent stating that this act is intended to be a permanent solution.

Other important policy initiatives also advanced during the 2018-2019 budget cycle were allowing one free course for FDNY at a CUNY school, and a new teachers loan forgiveness program. The other budget initiatives include:

- \$16.3 million in funding for the Education Opportunity Programs and Education Opportunity Centers;
- \$5.9 million for the Higher Education Opportunity Program;
- \$600,000 in funding for SUNY's TeleCounseling Program;
- \$1.5 million for the former Joseph Murphy Institute at CUNY, which will be renamed the School of Labor and Urban Studies; and
- \$100,000 for the SUNY Orange BRIDGES Program.

COLLEGES & UNIVERSITIES

The Higher Education Committee is responsible for the review and analysis of legislation affecting various colleges and universities, public and private, within the state. This year, there was a large focus on the private college sector, but there were many other wide-ranging issues that affected the higher education institutions in the state. The committee also reviewed legislation on a variety of topics, ranging from TAP expansion for special circumstances, to issues dealing with leasing of state lands and the public university systems.

Extending TAP Eligibility for Students Forced to Transfer Due to Sudden College Closure

The committee advanced legislation (S.1243) sponsored by the Chairman, that would extend eligibility for the Tuition Assitance Program (TAP) for undergraduate students who were forced to transfer to another institution as a result of a permanent college closure. This legislation was developed due to Dowling College's sudden permanent closure, and the ensuing issues many students had after they had to come up with an alternate plan to finish their education. This legislation passed the both houses and has been delivered to the Governor.

Enhanced Maintenance of Effort Provisions for SUNY and CUNY

The committee advanced legislation (S.7259-A) sponsored by the Chairman, that would create enhanced maintenance of effort provisions. The legislation would ensure that all mandatory costs are fully funded each year at an amount no less than the prior fiscal year, including collective bargaining costs and the TAP gap. This legislation has passed both houses and is awaiting delivery to the Governor.

Extending Tuition Waivers for NYPD Students at CUNY

The committee advanced legislation (Chapter 67 of 2018), sponsored by Senator Golden, that would extend the current law and allow NYPD officer students at CUNY institutions to take one course with a tuition waiver. This law has been extended for another 2 years.

Authorization for SUNY Stony Brook to Lease Certain Lands to Ronald McDonald House of Long Island, Inc.

The committee advanced legislation to allow SUNY Stony Brook to lease certain state lands to Ronald McDonald House of Long Island, Inc. for the purposes of creating a new facility in conjunction with Stony Brook's Children's Hospital (S.8187-A), which was sponsored by Senator Flanagan. Ronald McDonald House provides important support to families who have children fighting illnesses. This legislation has passed both houses and is awaiting delivery to the Governor.

Extending laws authorizing the State Education Department Bureau of Proprietary School Supervision (BPSS)

The committee advanced legislation to extend the law creating BPSS and ensure the continuation of proper supervision over this sector of higher education (Chapter 107 of 2018), sponsored by the Chairman. The current law has been extended for another 4 years.

Authorization for SUNY Stony Brook to Lease Certain Lands to Southampton Hospital

The committee advanced legislation, sponsored by the Chairman (S.9103-A), that would allow the lease of certain state lands to Southampton Hospital. This legislation was the culmination of many years of negotiation and a move to affiliate Southampton Hospital with SUNY Stony Brook University Hospital. A new hospital will be constructed on these lands, which will be an important step toward improving facilities and health care delivery in the region. This legislation has passed both houses and has been delivered to the Governor.

THE PROFESSIONS

The Higher Education Committee is responsible for the review and analysis of legislation affecting various licensed professions within the State. This year, most of the discussions relating to the professions took place after the passage of the 2018-2019 State Budget. The committee reviewed legislation on a variety of topics, ranging from licensure for athletic trainers, licensure for genetic counselors, licensure for school psychologists, limited licenses, professional discipline and more.

Licensure of Athletic Trainers

The committee advanced legislation (S.1356-B), sponsored by Senator Funke, relating to licensure of athletic trainers. The legislation provides many needed updates to the athletic trainers' scope of practice, and provides clarity to the setting restriction that is in the current statute for registration of athletic trainers. The scope of practice would expand to allow athletic trainers to work with athletes off a sports field, and allow these professionals to have a more flexible role in training athletes who are not professional athletes. Allowing licensure for athletic trainers would provide more public protection, especially in dealing with sports injuries and concussion management. This legislation died in the Rules committee.

Licensure of Genetic Counselors

The committee advanced legislation (S.1323-B), sponsored by the Chairman, relating to licensure of genetic counselors. This legislation would create a scope of practice for genetic counselors, including education and experience requirements. This legislation also would deal with the unique issue of corporate practice for this profession and create a process to hold corporate settings that employ genetic counselors accountable in cases of wrongdoing. This legislation passed the Senate.

Licensure of School Psychologists

The committee advanced legislation (S.692-D), sponsored by Senator Ortt, relating to licensure of school psychologists. Currently, school psychologists are only eligible for certification in the state. This would elevate the profession to the level of licensure and provide for a pilot program for school psychologists to work with other professionals on the issue of heroin and opioid addiction in children. This legislation passed the Senate.

Authorizing Registered Pharmacy Interns to Perform Immunizations

The committee advanced legislation (S.1043-D), sponsored by Senator Funke, authorizing registered pharmacy interns to perform immunizations under the direct supervision of a pharmacist licensed in New York State. This legislation passed both houses, and has been delivered to the Governor.

Allowing Traveling Physicians to Practice Medicine in Conjunction with an Out-of-State Sports Team

The committee advanced legislation (S.4375-A), sponsored by Senator Funke, that would allow physicians who are not licensed in New York State to practice medicine in the state at discrete sanctioned sporting events involving their own teams, and such treatment shall only occur up to

five days before the event and three days after the event. This legislation has passed both houses and is awaiting delivery to the Governor.

Mandatory Continuing Education for Licensed Psychologists in New York State

The committee advanced legislation (S.7398-A), sponsored by Senator Valesky, that would mandate continuing education requirements for psychologists licensed in the State of the New York, at the request of the profession. This legislation has passed both houses and is awaiting delivery to the Governor.

Extending Restricted Dental Faculty Limited Licenses for Foreign Dental Faculty

The committee advanced legislation (Chapter 301 of 2018), sponsored by Senator Golden, that would extend provisions allowing for restricted dental faculty licenses for foreign dental faculty for another 2 years after the previous expiration of February 2019.

Extending the Effective Date for Pathologists' Assistants Licensure

The committee advanced legislation (Chapter 85 of 2018), sponsored by the Chairman, that would push out the effective date for licensure of pathologists' assistants in New York. This ensured there would be no gap or issue with licensure for this class of professionals.

Provisional Permits for Clinical Laboratory Technology

The committee advanced legislation (Chapter 147 of 2018), sponsored by Senator DeFrancisco, that would solve a longstanding issue in regard to this profession. This creates a detailed provisional permit, and repeals the limited license that expired September 1, 2018. The limited license had a sunset of every few years, and this is a permanent solution to that problem that would enable those professionals to obtain the provisional permit while studying to pass the examination for a full license as a clinical laboratory technologist or histological technician, as long as they are under the supervision of a laboratory director.

NOMINATIONS

Pursuant to Title VII of the Senate Rules, the Higher Education Committee is charged with reviewing gubernatorial appointments to the Boards of Trustees of the College of Environmental Science and Forestry, Cornell University, City University of New York, City University Construction Fund, Higher Education Services Corporation, State University of New York and the State University Construction Fund. In addition, the committee reviews nominations by the Mayor of the City of New York to the City University Board of Trustees.

Nominees recommended by the Higher Education Committee are referred to the Senate Finance Committee. The following nominees were recommended and approved in 2018:
