#### COMMITTEE JURISDICTION AND OVERVIEW

The New York State Senate Standing Committee on Women's Issues has legislative oversight responsibilities for issues concerning women's rights, equality, equity, protection, and health.

During the 2020 Legislative Session, fifteen bills were referred to the Committee for review. Of these bills, five were reported from the Committee. One bill passed both the Senate and Assembly and was enacted.

The Women's Issues Committee met twice in 2020. Additional planned meetings were not held due to the COVID-19 pandemic. A list of all bills reported from the Committee is provided at the end of this report.

The Women's Issues Committee also held two Roundtables. The first addressed the egregious rates of Maternal & Child Health Mortality in upstate NY. The second covered Technology and its ever-growing relationship to Domestic Violence. Both Roundtables convened over Zoom and included the participation of advocates and experts from throughout New York State as well as other Senators and Committee Chairs.
