

COMMITTEE JURISDICTION AND OVERVIEW

The New York State Senate Standing Committee on Consumer Protection has legislative oversight responsibilities for issues arising under the General Business Law, including issues concerning unfair, deceptive and fraudulent businesses practices. A particular focus of the Committee is on electronic and online conduct affecting consumers, such as online marketing, disclosures, and data protection and on protecting student loan borrowers. The Committee emphasizes educating consumers and businesses about their rights and responsibilities.
